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School Safety: Ensuring the safety of our students and staff remains our top priority. We are constantly reviewing and updating our security measures to provide a safe and secure learning environment. This is accomplished through regularly attended meetings with our established District Crisis Team and Safety Team. In October we were able to send two staff members from our District Crisis Team to the School Safety Training held at Central Community College. The Nebraska Department of Education Hosted this conference in conjunction with the “I Love U Guys” Foundation. Training included learning about Standard Response Protocol and Reunification Methods. The purpose of this training was to bring about common signage and language when threats, hazards or incidents occur in communities to put everyone on the same page.

Winter Weather Safety: With the onset of winter, we must also prioritize the safety of our students and staff during inclement weather. Please ensure that you are well-prepared for the winter season by following these safety guidelines:

- Dress warmly: Encourage your child to wear appropriate winter clothing, including coats, gloves, hats, and boots to stay warm during cold weather.
- Be cautious on icy paths: Remind your child to walk carefully on slippery sidewalks and avoid running to prevent accidents.
- Plan for delays: Winter weather can sometimes disrupt our school schedule. Keep an eye on weather forecasts and be prepared for any severe weather conditions. We will always prioritize safety. Stay informed about school closures or delays by checking our district website, Social Media Page, and text message alert through Bright Arrow. If we have to call off school for inclement weather I will do my best to give everyone plenty of notice but the weather can be tricky at times so I would encourage you to have pre-arranged plans for cancellations, late starts, and early dismissals.

Thank you for being a part of our school district family. Your contributions make a significant impact on the lives of our students. We are truly thankful for each and every one of you.

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# Shell Creek Updates

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Dear 1st through 6th Grade Shell Creek Parents/Guardians,

Shell Creek Elementary grades 1-6 will be participating in a very special community service program to raise funds for the American Heart Association. We're joining in the fight against our nation's No. 1 and No. 3 killers – cardiovascular disease and stroke. Kids Heart Challenge (aka-Jump Rope for Heart) is a nationwide event that helps students learn about the benefits of regular physical activity and heart health while raising funds to fight heart disease and stroke. The money our school raises will fund potentially lifesaving research and will support programs that help people in our community. **The Shell Creek Students will be doing their Jump Rope for Heart the week of November 7th - 13th 2023 during P.E. class at Shell Creek Elementary.**

Most people do not realize that the roots for cardiovascular disease in adults often begin in childhood from age 10 and even younger. That's why it's important to make changes now to help your children and other family members eat healthy foods, stay physically active, and live tobacco-free.

As this year's coordinator, the students have shown a lot of interest and excitement in taking part in this year's Kids Heart Challenge. I will be sending home with each of them an information/money envelope along with this letter. This will have a listing of the prizes they can earn as well as your child's consent form. That's right, I said prizes! Students who collect money donations for their schools Kids Heart Challenge event will receive dollar amount prizes for their hard work from the American Heart Association.

**This year I am asking all parents to convert all cash and coins collected into one check. It makes it a lot easier to count the individual money collected and get it sent so the students receive their prizes sooner. If someone that donates wants to write a check, please ask him or her to write it out to the American Heart Association. I also encourage you to register your child online and collect money donations that way as much as possible. See the collection envelope for information to register online. I ask that you do not allow your son or daughter to go door to door asking for money donations. I would prefer that they ask friends and family for money donations. Parents may take collection envelopes to their place of employment if they wish. I am giving the students two weeks to collect money donations and turn the money back into me by November 7, 2023 or sooner.**

Kids Heart Challenge is a fun and effective way to teach heart-healthy living. It emphasizes the importance of physical activity as our children do something they enjoy. The money you contribute will fund research that will save more lives each year...

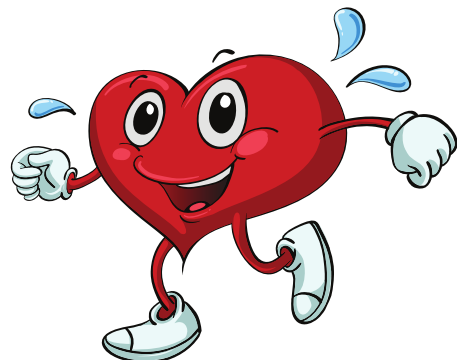

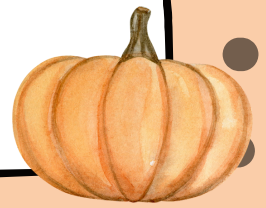






# Shell Creek - 1st Grade

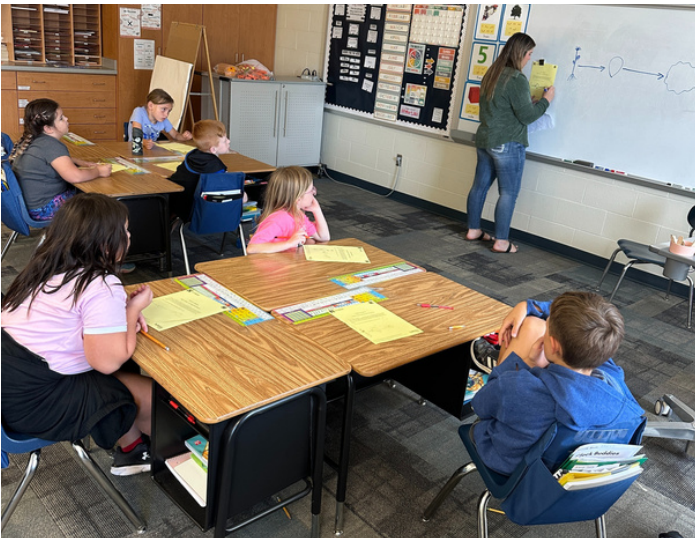
# Positively Popcorn

Did you know that Nebraska is one of the leading states in producing popcorn? Nebraska grows nearly 250 million pounds of popcorn per year! The second graders learned this when they got to spend some time with a representative from the Platte County Extension Office this month. They learned about the physical properties of matter and how it changes through... POPCORN! She read a book to the students, helped them draw the popcorn life cycle, watch it pop, and then have it as a snack! The students learned how the three stages of matter: solids, liquids, and gasses are all present when we pop popcorn!



# SHELL CREEK 5TH GRADE

## 1st Quarter:

-In Science students explored how organisms depend on one another and form an interconnected ecosystem. Students investigated food chains, food webs, and the importance of producers, consumers, and decomposers.

-In S.S. students reviewed the geography and regions of the United States, learned about the early people groups in the Americas (Inca, Aztec, Olmec, Maya), and looked at the different Native American tribes in North America.

-In Writing students learned about nouns, prepositions, types of sentences, proofreading sentences, and subjects and predicates.

- In Math students have reviewed and worked on place value concepts, numerical expressions (number properties & order of operations), adding and subtracting decimals, and we will start on multiplying whole numbers.

-In Reading students studied Narrative Nonfiction text and looked at how experiencing nature changes the way you think about it. We also studied Realistic Fiction and how we get the things we need. As well as Argumentative Text and the positive and negative effects of technology. Another genre studied was Informational Text and what good problem solvers do, along with a Folktale and when has a plan helped you accomplish a task, and poetry and what motivates you to accomplish a goal.

-We had an AR party for our 1st Quarter AR Achievers.

On September 19, Cornhusker Public Power came to share with the 5th graders the importance of power safety. Students learned about the difference between insulators and conductors and what some of them look like on power poles. They also demonstrated many electrical mistakes that happen in and around neighborhoods and homes. Students were also shown the correct way of how to exit a vehicle that a power line may be touching. Jay Wemhoff even climbed a telephone pole outside the school, after showing the different parts of the work gear they wear. Thanks to Cornhusker Public Power for coming to our classroom! Our students are now much more knowledgeable and can help their families be safe around electricity and power units!



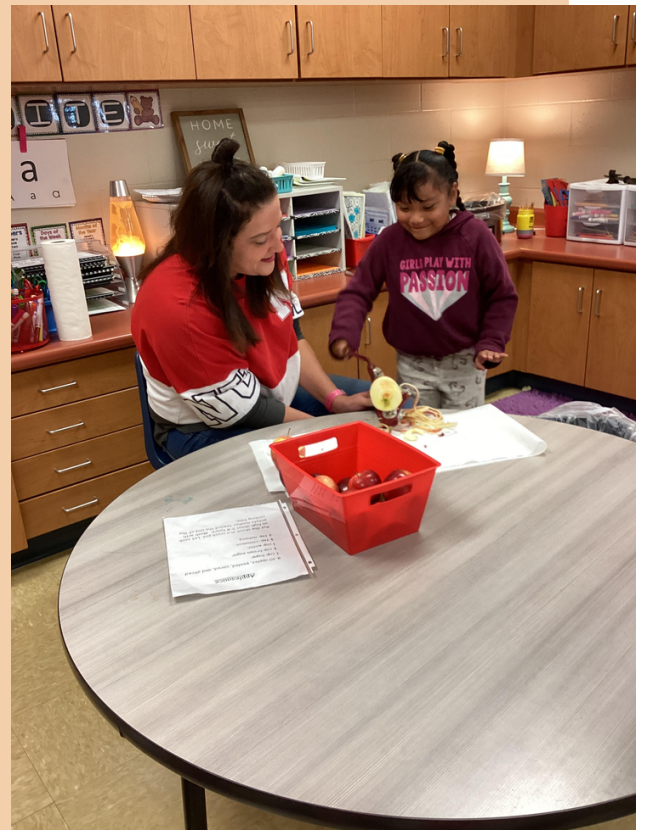


# KINDERGARTEN NEWSLETTER

Her favorite thing about teaching is building relationships with her students and family. If she could take her students anywhere she would take them to the children's museum in Lincoln.



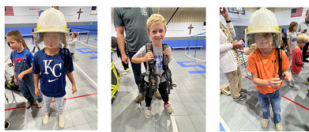
## Classroom News:

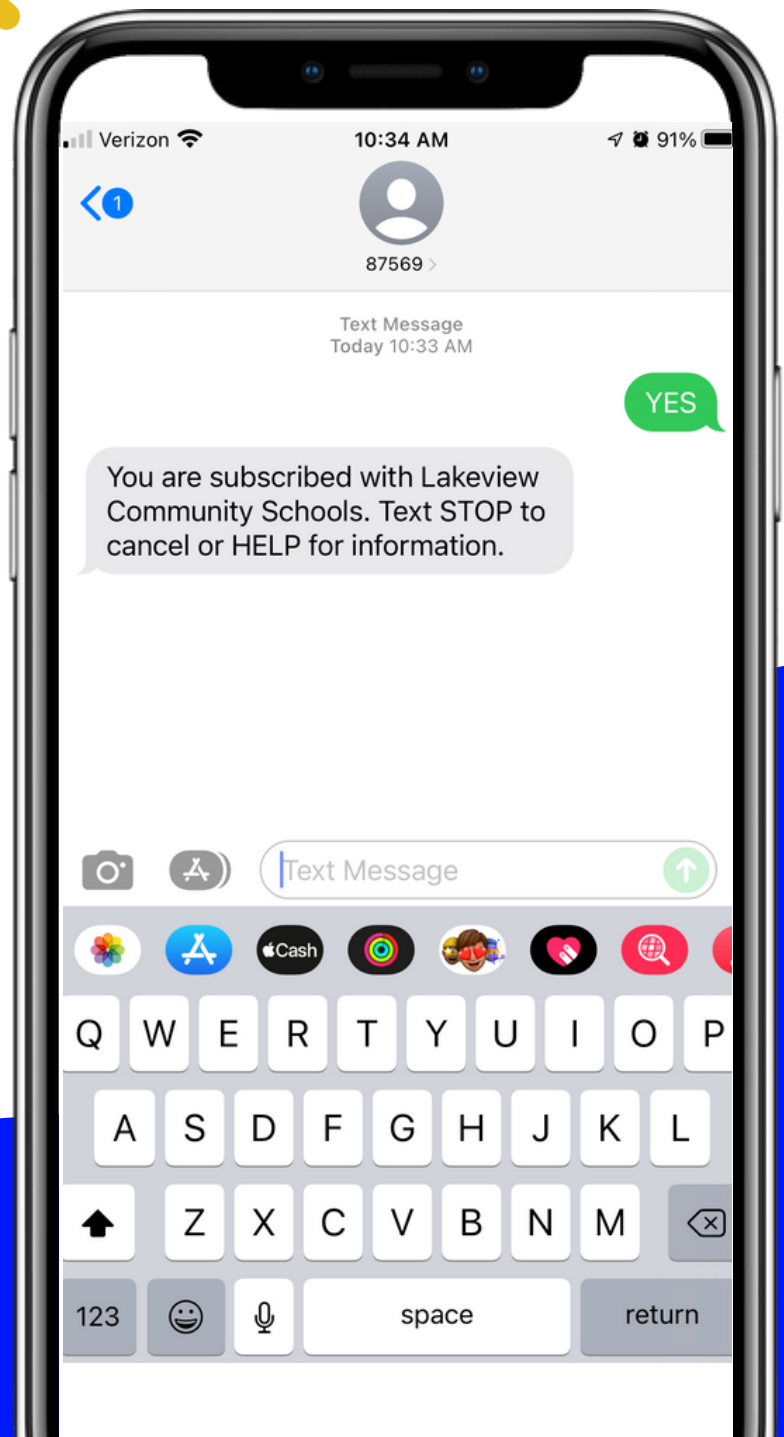
