Reading, Spelling, and Writing Summer Camps

WVU Speech, Language, Hearing Clinic will offer three therapeutic summer camps in June and July 2024 at our location: Applied Human Sciences Building (Evansdale Campus – behind Chick-fil-A), 375 Birch Street, Morgantown, WV.

Who is eligible?

Any child who is a resident of West Virginia and is in kindergarten through 4th grade.

When is camp happening?

Each summer camp is four weeks long and meets for three mornings, Monday through Wednesday:

9-10am: Reading Camp

10-11am: Spelling Camp

11-12pm: Writing Camp

Your child may participate in more than one camp but can only be enrolled in one four-week session (June or July).

What to anticipate at the WVU Speech, Language, Hearing Clinic Summer Camps?

After evaluating your child's language skills, students will receive instruction in small groups. Each week's camp programming will be structured to enhance your child's language and is structured as a 4-week program. The lessons will not be made up if you cannot attend a week of camp.

Graduate student clinicians training to be speech-language pathologists will be providing all therapy. Assistant Professor Tracy Toman, CCC-SLP, will provide all student clinician supervision.

What is the cost to you?

These therapeutic summer camps are a Rite Care clinic-funded opportunity provided at **no cost** for those needing reading, spelling, or writing instruction.
