Wheatland-Chili to Co-Host ROC2Change

This spring, Wheatland-Chili High School students will help empower hundreds of their peers from across the region to be forces for change.

Members of Students Together Against Racism (STAR) are collaborating with students at East Irondequoit and Rochester Early College International high schools to organize and co-host the upcoming ROC2Change Student Summit on Race. The biannual event centered on combatting racism brings together students from Rochester-area high schools to engage in facilitated dialogue and to address topics such as privilege, implicit bias, racial equity and social justice.

The student organizers of this spring's summit have been meeting monthly to work on all aspects of planning, including logistics, programming and branding. They have announced that the day's theme will be "Unity Grows Communities" and that Wheatland-Chili Graduate of Excellence Matthew Cook will be a keynote speaker.

The summit is set for March 15 at Monroe 2-Orleans BOCES Educational Services Center.







HS Student Addresses Local Leaders

Delivering a speech to a room full of high-profile figures is a stressful undertaking, but a Wheatland-



Chili High School student recently seized the opportunity and made the most of it.

Torrence Bansbach addressed politicians and school leaders during the Monroe County School Board Association (MCSBA) Legislative Breakfast in February.

The 10th grader was one of five students from districts across Monroe County selected to speak. Each student researched and presented a specific topic affecting local schools, such as mental health, free meals and diversity, equity and inclusion. Bansbach focused on electric buses. Gov. Kathy Hochul has mandated that all school buses purchased by 2027 must be zero-emission buses with districts' entire fleets transitioned to zero emission by 2035.



The annual Legislative Breakfast is an opportunity for school administrators and board members to meet with legislators to highlight issues impacting public school districts.

Ongoing Capital Improvements Progress

The District is gearing up for its next round of capital improvements. Construction on the new Middle/High School cafeteria and kitchen is set to begin after April break. The project includes a new serving line, additional seating and a new senior lounge. Additional improvements also beginning this Spring include:

- MS/HS nurse's suite and front hallway renovations
- Repayement of bus and drop-off loops at both schools
- Installation of new classroom door locksets with secure key fob access at both schools

The work is part of the \$5.8 million capital project approved by voters in May 2022.



Next Capital Project Vote Set for May 21

The District is planning for its next capital project vote to coincide with the 2024-25 budget and board election vote on May 21.

If approved, the project will not raise taxes and will cover much needed updates. The scope of the work includes:

- Roof repairs
- Repavement of parking lots
- MS/HS pool upgrades
- MS/HS counseling suite renovation

The District will release additional information on the proposed capital project in the coming weeks.


Wheatland-Chili Tackles Poverty Head-On

The District is bringing attention to poverty within the community and the steps it's taking to address the challenges facing families.

Last school year, 53% of Wheatland-Chili students experienced economic disadvantages — a 240% increase since the 2008-09 school year when only 22% of students were identified as living in poverty. Superintendent Lynda Quick presented data on the District's changing demographics during the Board of Education meeting on January 9, coinciding with Poverty Awareness Month.

Many scientific studies have found a strong correlation between poverty and gaps in academic achievement. Despite the growing poverty rate, Wheatland-Chili's current four-year graduation rate is 93%. Quick credits strong instruction, dedicated staff and initiatives like free meals, equity-driven learning tools and systems of support and programs to create stronger partnerships with families.

The District will continue to explore new strategies and to push to remove barriers and bridge gaps, investing in students and families over the entire span of their educational experience to help them cross the finish line with a diploma prepared for college and careers.



Advocacy in Action: School Bus Safety Day Named in Honor of T. J. Connor Student

Next school year, T. J. Connor will celebrate the inaugural Coyle O'Shea School Bus Safety Day during National School Bus Safety Week.

The day to promote and educate students on school bus safety is named for third grader Coyle O'shea in recognition of his advocacy for bus safety. O'Shea prepared and delivered an impassioned speech to the Board of Education on the importance of promoting bus safety. Soon after, Director of Transportation Sheryl Guidice announced that the District would expand its education efforts during School Bus Safety Week and devote Coyle O'Shea School Bus Safety Day to promoting the cause.

National School Bus Safety Week is set for October 21-25.

Once a Wildcat, Always a Wildcat: Berl's School Journey Comes Full Circle

Samantha Berl graduated from Wheatland-Chili High School in 2014 as salutatorian. Nearly a decade later, she is helping put the District's youngest learners on the path to academic excellence as a first grade teacher at T. J. Connor.

Besides scoring top grades, Berl also scored on the field, court and course during her time as a Wheatland-Chili student, playing soccer, basketball, softball and golf. She also worked at Wheatland Recreation's summer camps. Berl is now an assistant coach for Wheatland-Chili Girls Varsity Soccer and still helps with community summer and sports programs.

Berl went to college at SUNY Geneseo. While she started out majoring in business, she eventually switched her focus to education, realizing that what she has always really wanted to do is teach. After earning her bachelor's degree at Geneseo and her master's at the University at Buffalo, she started her career substituting at Wheatland-Chili before being

hired as a full-time kindergarten teacher at Elba Central School District.

When a permanent position became available at T. J. Connor three years later, Berl jumped at the chance and was hired for the 2022-23 school year. While she started out with kindergarten, she made the decision to move up with her class and is teaching first grade this year.

Berl's connections to Wheatland-Chili run deep. She works with her mother, Nancy, at T. J. Connor, and her father, Greg, has served on the Board of Education for eight years. Her neighbor and fourth grade teacher Pamela Merrit was her mentor during her first year at T. J. Connor before Merrit retired at the end of the last school year.

As her journey comes full circle, Berl's return to make a positive impact on the place that helped shape her own path is an inspiring example of the enduring ties that bind our school community together.






HS Band Students perform with Hochstein Youth Wind Symphony
