The **mission** of the FullCircle Program is to serve families with teens and young adults struggling with a range of addiction and mental health challenges by providing a long-term faith-based Enthusiastic Recovery alternative peer support group and peer support coaching services at **no cost**.

CALLING AND HISTORY

- 2010** Support group founded in Tempe, AZ.
- 2015** Program opens in Kansas City support group grows and FullCircle opens their current "shop" in downtown Tempe.
- 2016** Established as a 501c(3).
- 2019** Program opens in Denver, Colorado.
- 2020** FullCircle Georgia support group is born and shop opens July, 2020.

66% of our young people who enter the FullCircle support group were sober one year later. That is more than **DOUBLE** that of an average adolescent treatment center.

FULLCIRCLE MODEL

THE PROBLEM



In recent years, The United States has seen the greatest number of overdose deaths ever recorded. In the midst of the opioid/fentanyl crisis, treatment programs cannot keep up with the growing number of families in crisis.



Due to the Covid pandemic, teens and young adults experienced an increased level of isolation and stress causing adverse mental health issues and rates of substance use to skyrocket.

OUR SOLUTION



Connection is the opposite of addiction. FullCircle offers a recovery community for teens and young adults recovering together!



FullCircle is founded on the Enthusiastic Model: in order for young people to embrace recovery, the alternative must be more **fun** and more **fulfilling** than their self-destructive behaviors..



Substance abuse destroys everyone around us including our family and community. FullCircle provides family support meetings weekly along with appointments with our staff.

KEY DISTINCTIONS
