Easter also shared areas we would like to grow such as the EL Reclassifications and Mrs. Nelson has been doing a great job getting our students to be reclassified before they go into High school or ASAP. Other areas we want to keep growing in are MCC parent involvement, Suspension rate, Daily attendance rate, and student climate data metrics. Joel asked what culture and climate are. Mr. Easter shares it starts with the Mustang way, beyond that we focus on character traits and focus on the feedback our students provide from the questionnaire we send out. We will be sending out an LCAP survey to our parents.
