As we step into the month of April, it is a pleasure to witness the blossoms of spring and the vibrancy and new growth it brings. I hope this newsletter finds you well and ready for the exciting events and opportunities ahead.

Upcoming Events:

- 1. **Spring Break**: Beginning next week (April 8th -13th) our students and faculty will be on break. This is a time for students to recharge, spend quality time with family and friends, and reset their goals as the conclusion of the school year approaches.
- 2. Earth Day: (April 22nd) Our 5th and 6th grade students have been participating in Audubon's Debris Prevention Education in the Long Island Sound Watershed program this year within their science classes. In advance of Earth Day, our 5th graders made posters to hang around the school to raise awareness of the goal to reduce plastic waste in our school yard. "What goes on the ground goes in the sound!" Concurrently, the 6th graders wrote letters to Parks and Rec asking them to install better garbage cans out at the sports fields with supporting evidence from our general observations and school yard clean-up data.

On Monday April 22nd (Earth Day), we will have a ribbon-cutting ceremony for our two new water fountains with bottle refill stations installed in the gym and the cafeteria. This year's Earth Day International Theme is "Planet vs. Plastics" which makes this the perfect day for this event. Thank you to our PTA who contributed to the fountains.

Academic Updates:

- 1. **Focus on Growth**: As we move further into the trimester, we encourage students to remain focused on their academic goals and continue striving for growth and improvement. This may include diligent study habits, seeking support/help if needed, or exploring new areas of interest.
- 2. **Standardized Assessments**: As standardized assessment season is approaching, please assist us in reminding our students to approach these evaluations with confidence, a growth mindset, and to take the time to apply strategies reinforced throughout the year. 


Hello from the ELMS Science Department!

Everyday the ELMS Science Department continues to find creative methods to engage students in our shared love of learning Science, whether it is through hands-on, inquiry based activities, field experiences, and/or project-based learning. Here is a sneak peek into some of our ELMS Science classrooms!

Grade 5 & 6 collaborate with the CT Audubon Society to Raise Awareness about Marine Plastic!

This year we have had the honor to be chosen to participate in the *Debris Prevention Education in the Long Island Sound Watershed program with the CT Audubon Society.*This program is funded by the National Fish and Wildlife Federation Long Island Sound Futures Fund. The students have met with Audubon educators three times thus far. We conducted a school yard clean-up in October and picked up 146 pounds of trash around



end up in Long Island Sound. With additional funding provided by our generous PTA, we have purchased two water fountains with refill stations for our school in an effort to reduce plastic bottle waste.

Our Grade 7 science students have been studying properties of matter. Within this topic, students have been engaging in hands-on opportunities to develop their scientific skills to precisely observe and measure different properties of matter. Student scientists have also been learning about experimental design, specifically differentiating between independent, dependent, and controlled variables. Lastly, students explore atomic structure, molecules, mixtures and compounds and what changes occur during chemical reactions.

Finally, our Grade 8 science students participated in a field trip to Project O located at University of Connecticut Avery Point campus this Fall. While on campus, students worked in the lab to make qualitative and quantitative observations of many organisms that live in Long Island Sound. The enthusiasm in the classroom was very high as students discussed characteristics of lobsters, skates, horseshoe crabs, blue crabs, puffer fish, and so many other organisms. Then students spent their afternoon aboard Project O's research vessel where they worked in science teams to collect both biotic and abiotic data in an effort to analyze the overall health of Long Island Sound.

All 7th and 8th grade students are looking forward to our upcoming trip to Quassy Amusement Park in May to participate in a STEM day to observe forces and motion in a real world setting! Permission slips are due on April 5th. Please reach out to your student's Science teacher with any questions about this awesome field
