#### REVIEWING OUR MATH AND LITERACY CURRICULUM

This year, our K-5 students experienced a new math resource, Imagine Learning Illustrative Mathematics. This widely respected and research-driven resource addresses math instruction with an interactive, problem-based, collaborative, and inclusive approach that promotes deep student thinking and reasoning.

Our grade 6-8 students have continued to utilize Cengage Big Ideas to support their math learning. This resource embraces an exploratory approach to math, promoting deep conceptual understanding, meaningful applications, and student independence.

An English Language Arts Curriculum and Resource Review Committee has been established this year to engage in a two-year review of our literacy instruction. The committee has partnered with literacy experts from *The Reading League* to help guide our work in applying evidence-based practices aligned with the science of reading.



#### STUDENT LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Empowering the next generation of courageous leaders is embedded in our District's vision. Our students eagerly participate in organizations such as the Service Club (pictured left), the peer-to-peer Hope Squad support group, bus patrol leaders, and Student Ambassadors who assist new students at the middle school.

FSD79 is proud to partner with District 120 on the Aspire 120 program. Students from Mundelein High School who are interested in pursuing education are partnered with a Fremont teacher for mentoring and a hands-on practical experience.

## STAFF MARKET ADJUSTMENTS

To improve employee retention and address growing vacancies, FSD79 made market adjustments to all employee groups in Fiscal Year 2024. Ultimately, this investment ensures the best education for our students. The District now meets the legislated requirement for starting teacher salaries and achieved market competitiveness in the region. Students are now benefiting from complete staffing and improved teacher consistency. The FY24 budget remains balanced with this decision.

## FAIR FUNDING ADVOCACY

The District is advocating for a modernized Charter School funding formula at the state level. Over \$600,000 (34%) of Fremont's State funding is routed to Prairie Crossing Charter School, which currently serves approximately 2% of the student population. Our local taxpayers are paying for an outdated funding model.

## SCHOOL PROJECT MAINTENANCE GRANT


The District has successfully secured the Illinois School Project Maintenance Grant. This grant will be utilized explicitly for crucial tuckpointing repairs at our elementary school. The total cost of the project is estimated at \$110,000, of which \$50,000 will be funded by the state.


#### **LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS TAX RATE COMPARISON (2022)**




#### FREMONT SCHOOL DISTRICT 79 BUDGET ALLOCATION (FY 2024)

#### DID YOU KNOW? FSD79...

- Will complete bond repayment from the 2003 referendum in 2025, resulting in a reduction in debt payments by taxpayers.
- Has one of the lowest elementary school district tax rates in the region (see insert).
- Conducted a facility assessment in April 2023 and identified \$30.2 million (in 2023 fiscal dollars) in facility needs related to maintenance/repair, mechanicals, electrical systems, security, and site needs.
- Enrollment is expected to increase by 14% by 2033 and up to 50% by 2043 according to a recent demographic study.

#### PLANNING FOR ENROLLMENT GROWTH

With three neighborhood developments currently in the works and 3,700+ residential units expected from the proposed Ivanhoe Village development, **FSD79** is anticipating an enrollment growth of approximately 1,000 students over the next two decades, a 50% increase. The influx of students would prompt facility expansion needs estimated at approximately \$107 million (in 2023 fiscal dollars).



The District is working with the Village of Mundelein and developers for fair financial agreements to compensate for facility needs and to ensure adequate operating revenue.
