We are very grateful to the Nazareth Family Foundation for an outreach grant. We were asked to use this grant to make an impact to organizations beyond our own mission. Our mission calls out service to God and others in our mission statement and it is a priority at Nazareth, with our students required to earn 10 hours a semester for each of the four years they are students. It is very exciting that many students are recognized in the spring for reaching 100 years of service in the academic year. Last year, Mrs. Theresa Stanton started a Community Day of Service. There are weekly and monthly service projects throughout the year to many organizations. After thoughtful consideration of the impact to our students and to those served by these organizations, Nazareth Academy High School proudly supported:

St. Lucy School for Children with Visual Impairments Saint Lucy School for Children with Visual Impairments is one of the three Special Education Schools of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. For many years, Nazareth Academy High School has hosted students from St. Lucy's in a day-long event. Each year, Nazareth Academy High School welcomes students from St. Lucy Day School for Children with Visual Impairment. The day includes science projects, gym activities, snacks in the Student Dining Room, music performances, story time, and even a rocket launch by our Rocketry Club for the children of the visiting schools.

Legacy of Life Foundation Empowering life change and investing in educating, inspiring, and supporting women in unplanned pregnancies to find the strength to choose life. Legacy of Life Centers not only provide that critical support in the immediacy of their crisis pregnancy need, but the support and resources needed after the birth for at least three years. Free ultrasounds provide the woman with the first image of her child on the ultrasound screen. 80% of the women who see the ultrasound screen choose life for their baby.

Morgan's Light Foundation Morgan's Light was established in 2020 after Nazareth graduate, Morgan McCaffery '20 lost her life in a teen dating violence incident. They shed light on toxic teenage relationships to help those in our community recognize the signs. They believe in acting with urgency in order to raise public awareness about teenage relationship violence. The Foundation comes to speak to our students annually about teen dating violence and educates students on the importance of building and maintaining healthy relationships, distinguishing between healthy, unhealthy and toxic relationships, recognizing warning signs and patterns of abusive relationships, safely ending an abusive relationship and community resources/services that are available, and sharing strategies on how to help friend who might be in need.

Mother of Mercy House In 2015, Mother of Mercy House was opened, inspired by Pope Francis' call to "be a poor Church for the poor," to be a "field hospital," to "take the Church to the frontiers," to "move beyond our comfort zones" and be where others might not want to be. The Mother of Mercy House was founded with a simple desire to be the presence of Christ in our community and work each day to meet the spiritual, physical and emotional needs of

our Kensington neighbors with love, as we share the mercy of God. Initiatives included a food pantry, after school program that includes homework time, life skills, computers, art and other activities, outside sports (weather permitting), summer camps that include games, computer, art, cooking, outdoor sports and academics and clothing ministries.

Breathing Room Foundation: The Breathing Room Foundation improves the lives of families affected by cancer by ensuring no one feels alone in their fight. They provide individualized care and support to families affected by cancer by addressing their most critical needs so that they can concentrate their efforts on regaining their physical health, providing care and support to families affected by cancer. A cancer diagnosis affects every aspect of a family's life; emotional, physical, spiritual and financial. We strive to provide a family with whatever it is that will allow them a bit of "breathing room" from their daily struggle against cancer.

Senior Prom at Citizens Bank Park






Senior Farewell - General Parent Meeting 5/7

Panda Perks - May 2nd




