This includes the planning, coordination, implementation, and program evaluation necessary to carry out initiatives for student recruitment, admissions, financial assistance, and retention of students. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Employs, supervises, evaluates, and retains professional administrative and teaching personnel and support personnel for faith community, academic, and student affairs.
- Disseminates information to employees, parents, students, and the broader community via the school website, mailings, and both internal and external newsletters.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE POSITION

With regard to the Faith Community Affairs of the school, the Principal:

- Oversees the mission, charism, and Catholic identity of the school.
- Articulates and promotes the mission, vision, and Catholic identity of the school to the school's public (institutional advocacy).

- Ensures that all religious, academic, and student affairs programs reflect the Catholic mission, charism, and identity of the school.
- Employs, supervises, evaluates, and retains the Campus Minister.
- Ensures implementation of a program of religious instruction as prescribed by the Diocese of Monterey.
- Ensures implementation of a spiritual life program for faculty and staff.
- Ensures implementation of a comprehensive spiritual life program for students including:
 - » Liturgies and para-liturgical services,
 - » Prayer lives,
 - » Retreats,
 - » Service-learning programs,
 - » Campus ministry activities,
 - » Good relations with feeder parishes.

With regard to the Academic Affairs of the school, the Principal:

- Administers with staff the day-to-day operations of the school.
- Employs and retains professional administrators, chairpersons, teachers, and support staff.
- Ensures, through the Assistant Principal for Academics, the assignment, supervision, development, and evaluation of chairpersons and teachers.
- Designs and implements with staff, appropriate curriculum and teaching/ learning processes ensuring that the written curriculum is taught, tested, and evaluated.
- Ensures that effective guidance and counseling programs are in place.
- Ensures appropriate communication with and involvement of parents in the educational process.
- Ensures that up-to-date educational technology is in place and integrated into curriculum and instruction.

With regard to the Student Affairs of the school, the Principal:

- Designs and implements with staff, effective co-curricular and extracurricular activities.
- Employs and retains the Student Activities Director and, through the Assistant Principal for Student Life, ensures the supervision, training, and evaluation of the Student Activities Director.
- Supervises the Athletic Director and the organization and administration of the program of interscholastic athletics including, but not limited to, all school athletic personnel, events, competitions, policies, procedures, and facilities.
- Ensures with staff, the implementation of policies concerning student discipline, decorum, health, and safety.



With regard to Diocesan, Board of Trustees, and Community Relations, the Principal:

- Maintains good relations and communications with the Diocese of Monterey through the Diocesan Superintendent of Schools or other representatives.
- Maintains good relations and communications with partner parishes/ schools, pastors, principals, and staff.
- Maintains good relations with the larger Catholic and civic communities including the media, organizations, businesses, corporations, foundations, etc.
- Works with the Board of Trustees and the implementation of the strategic plan and ensures regular communication to the school's public with regard to the status of the strategic plan.
- Ensures fair and just personnel practices in keeping with the social teachings of the Catholic Church.

With regard to the Business Affairs of the school, the Principal:

- Employs, supervises, evaluates, and retains office staff and business administrators.
- Oversees accounts payable and receivable.
- Oversees budget and financial planning.
