


### Project Lead the Way: Building Community

The students have been asked to design an outdoor community area, incorporating a fireplace, intended to not only provide warmth in the winter, but a welcoming atmosphere for residents and guests alike.

The students were given an initial list of criteria, which was submitted and reviewed by the sponsors. After grasping the scope and size of the project and assessing the current state of the location, they started researching elements of the design. They want the final project to tie into the redevelopment of Main St, allowing the overall design to be cohesive.

Brainstorming and a decision matrix was used to create a proposal that is being vetted, updated, and assessed by the community sponsors. Students then move the designs from paper to 3D models, enhancing the visual effects, and test the design.

We hope to have a follow up in the next issue as this community project grows into a beautiful space for all to enjoy!


## Spelling Bee Champion!
