AIR SCOUTS -- SQUADRON NO. 1

"Sea Hawks" Squadron No. 1, sponsored by the Corpus Christi College-Academy, was founded in 1944 by Father Augustine Linbeck, OSB, as the first of its kind in the Gulf Coast Council. Father Augustine has received, during the past year, the Silver Beaver award for his outstanding work in scouting. Father Harold Heiman, OSB, present leader, took over the squadron in 1946.

Squadron No. 1 consists of twenty registered scouts and has been active throughout the year in community, outdoor, and social activities. They have participated in many local scout demonstrations, such as, the Scout-O-Rama merit badge exhibition, and a council bivouac. They won top honors in a tri-state, regional bivouac. Their social program consists of dancing, skating, caroling, and hay rides. The Air Scouts had a very important role in staging the annual Senioree Ball, in February. The outdoor program is characteristic of the Gulf Coast and includes such sports as boating, hunting, and swimming.

The unit was organized for the purpose of fostering leadership and developing character. It draws its entire membership from the College-Academy.
