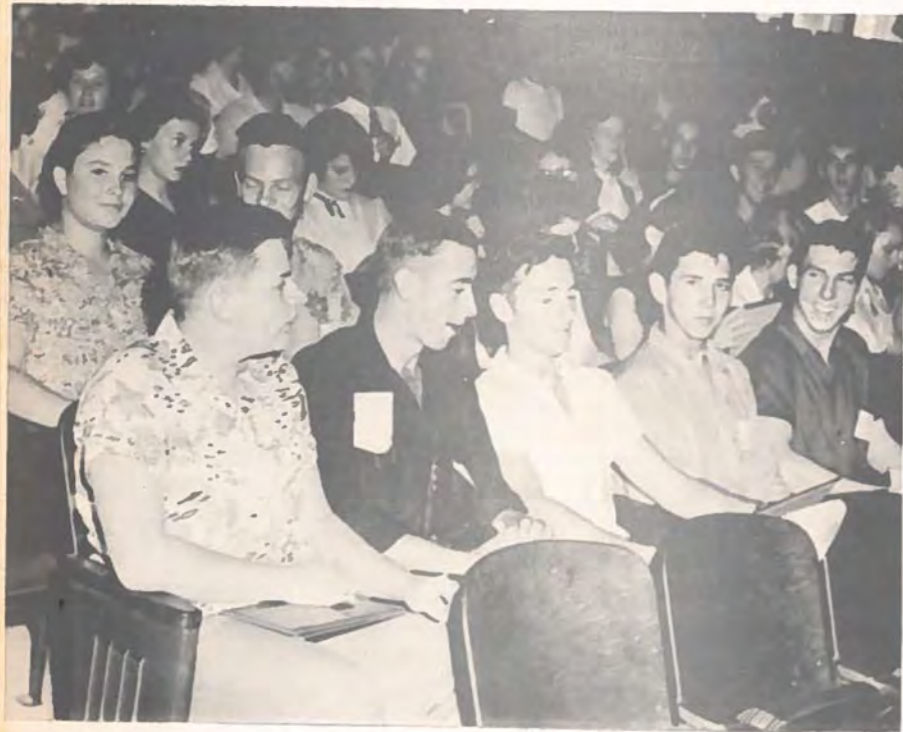

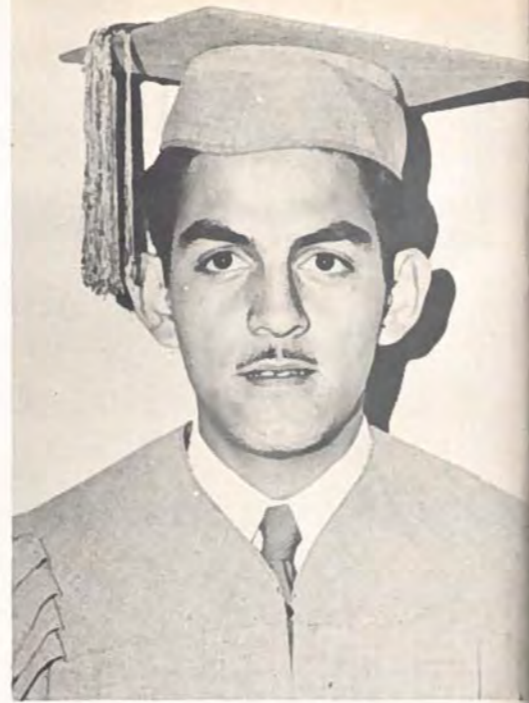

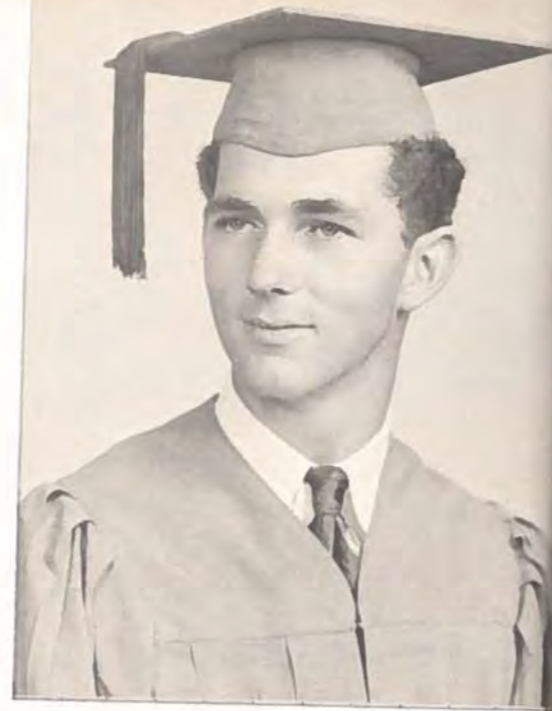

Paul asked that it be abandoned because of that, he was right." But much good did come from the organization. The Academy became well known throughout the state, it had a reputation for energetic

work, many of its graduates were able to secure scholarships to colleges and universities upon the recommendation of Coach Quigley. The city became aware of the school building on her outskirts.

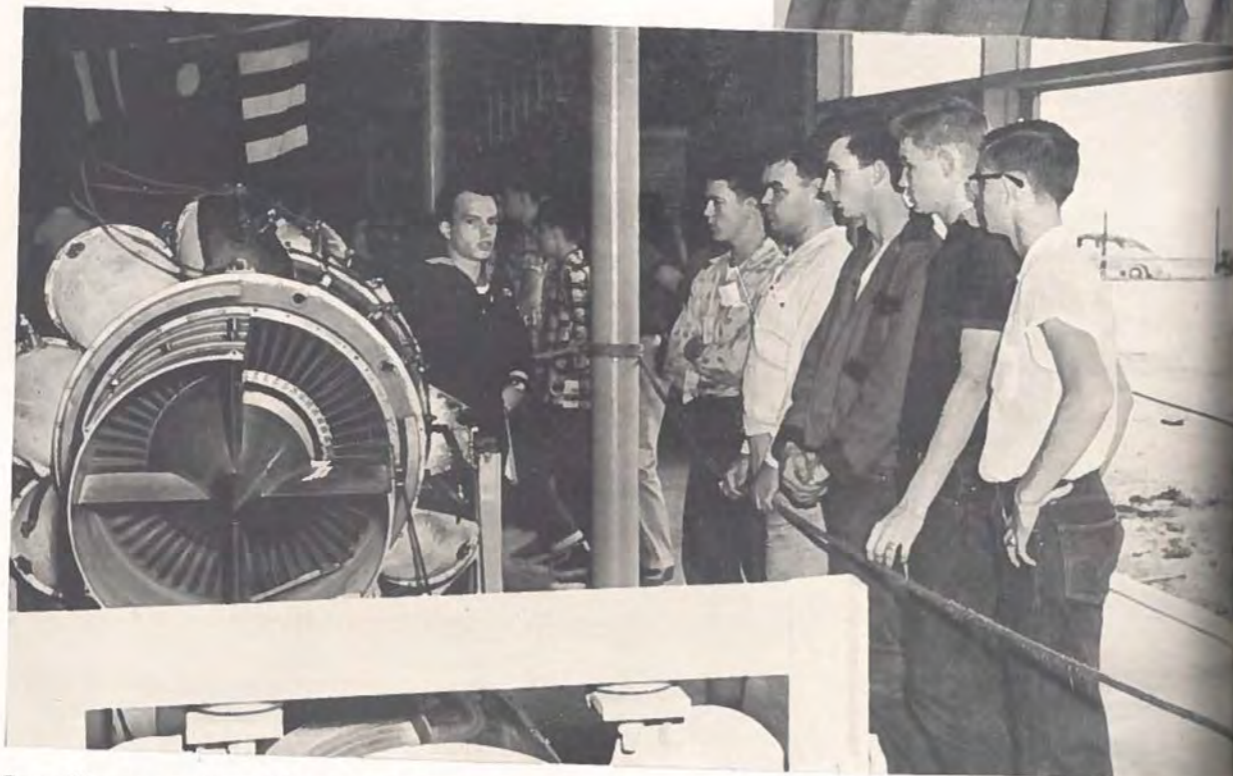

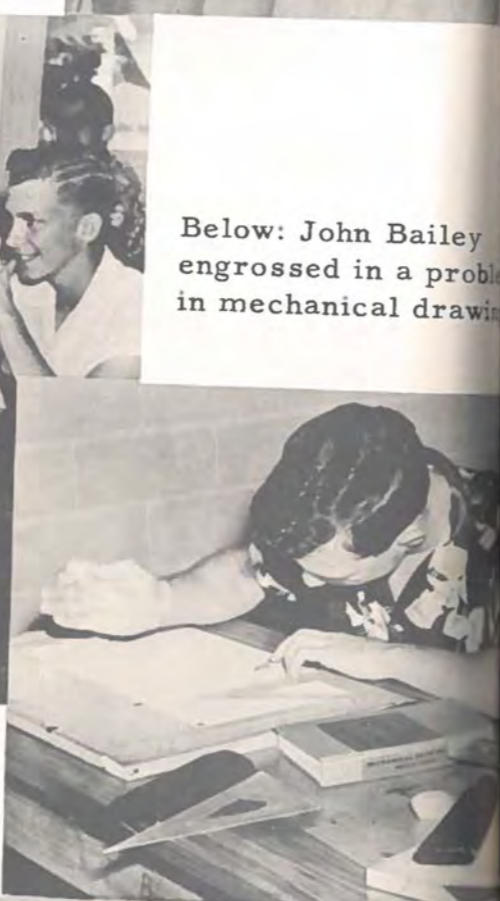
