









About the only really consistent offensive gesture made by the Corpus Christi team came after Freer had rolled up a 25-0 lead.



With 20 seconds remaining in the first half, Conde passed to Moran who raced into the end zone. The play covered 59 yards and gave a halftime score of 28-6.




Sowa scored all three Cavalier touchdowns.
