



2024 Community Scholarships – Due April 23, 2024

If you are awarded a 2024 community scholarship you will be *required* to dress up & show up to participate in our scholarship awards ceremony on the **morning of Tuesday, June 4th in the Eccles. This is mandatory, a no-show means forfeiting your scholarship.** A personal thank you note also needs to be written to your scholarship donor and turned in to the **counseling office by Thursday, May 30th** Thank you notes can be found in the counseling office, this needs to be done *before* you can receive your scholarship.

Also, please note that the scholarship amounts and/or number of scholarships may be subject to change after the review process. All scholarships are worth at least \$500. You are invited to apply for up to 4 scholarships with the hopes of receiving 1 scholarship. *Unfortunately, due to limited funding, not all students who apply will receive a PCHS Community Scholarship.*

Abbey Lee Peterson Cordery Memorial Scholarship – 1 Scholarship for \$1,000

Criteria:

- The student has participated in community and environmental service
- Student who loves to read and loves animals
- Student who likes to travel, and ski

Alumni of Jeremy Ranch Elementary Scholarship – 1 scholarship for \$1000

• Criteria:

Attended Jeremy Ranch Elementary School

Include an Essay of 500 words or less:

“Tell us about a contribution you have made to your community”

American Legion Citizenship Scholarship, awarded by Park City American Legion Post 14 – 4 scholarships for \$1000

• Criteria:

- Citizenship and Community Service
- Financial Need

Athenaeum Club of Park City Scholarship - 1 for Scholarship for \$2,000

- Planning to pursue a trade (for example Cosmetology, Esthetician, Electrician, EMT, HVAC, Plumbing, Culinary Arts, Dental Assistant, etc.)

Criteria:

- Special preference is given to students who are current or former residents of affordable housing built by Mountainlands Community Housing Trust including Holiday Village Apartments, Parkside Apartments, Richer Place Apartments, Washington Mill Apartments, The Line Condominiums, or Woods of Parley's Lane.
 - If not a resident of a Mountainlands project must be a current or former resident of any affordable apartment or deed-restricted home in the community.
 - Must have a 2.0 or higher cumulative GPA.
 - Must have at least one year of community or extracurricular involvement.
 - Please include the address of the property you live in or lived in

Grant Seaver Memorial Scholarship – 1 scholarship for \$1000

Celebrating Grant Seaver, who was an empathetic, fun-loving, adventurous, kind, and funny kid with a genuine smile, who was comfortable in his skin, and a loyal friend who went out of his way for others. He was a Park City student who tragically died too young.

- Criteria:
 - Brief essay addressing the above qualities and why you are best qualified to receive this scholarship.
 - Possibly involved in athletics – you need not be the best but have a passion for your activity and celebrate your fellow adventurers
 - Perhaps a dual immersion student who loves or would love to travel to connect with people in their language.

“For a student attending school in the Boston area”

- Criteria:
 - Awarded to a student attending a college or university in the greater Boston/Cambridge, MA area
 - 1-2 paragraphs explaining why you think you will love Boston

- Criteria:
 - For a student majoring in business with an emphasis on entrepreneurship

- Criteria:
 - Financial need
 - Involved in athletics (love of skiing or tennis preferred)

Submit (to Ms. Elliot, our scholarship counselor) a one-two minute vocal recording addressing:

1. (M) MOTIVATION – How do you derive it, and how will you sustain it, even when obstacles arise?
2. (A) ADAPTABILITY – How do you adapt to the moving pieces in your life, and why is it important to adapt to your environment?
3. (C) Character – How do you build character, and why is one's character important?



McPolin Elementary Alumni Scholarship – 1 scholarship for \$500

- Criteria:
 - Graduated from McPolin Elementary
 - Short essay (max. 750 words): Describe your "McPolin Moment." Write about a faculty member and/or experience from your time at McPolin that impacted you positively. Be specific in detailing the context and make sure to articulate the connection to why it was meaningful and how it influenced you.

Mountain Valley Stone Scholarship - 1 scholarship for \$500

- Criteria:
 - Maintain a 2.5 GPA or higher
 - A student indicates financial need
 - Student displays a commitment to make the community better through community service or community involvement

National Honor Society Scholarship – 4 Scholarships for \$1,000 each

Criteria: (Flexible)

- A student who has shown academic improvement after possibly struggling in their early years of high school
- An individual who gives back to the community and thinks of others
- Possibly someone who has turned their life around after dealing with an unforeseen challenge.
- Possibly a student in financial need

On Top Roofing and Electric Scholarship - 2 scholarships for \$2000

- Criteria:
 - 3.5 GPA (Flexible)
 - Pursue Business as a major
 - Involved in sports

Oscar Wedegaertner Memorial Scholarship Music -1 scholarship for \$3000

“Named for a man who volunteered in all levels of public education: K-college level. To reward outstanding academic achievement”

- Criteria:
 - Music Scholarship-** A student who participated in HS band, or orchestra for at least 3 years
 - Must specify you are applying for the Oscar Wedegaertner Music Scholarship**



Oscar Wedegaertner Memorial Scholarship Public School -1 scholarship for \$3000

“Named for a man who volunteered in all levels of public education: K-college level. To reward outstanding academic achievement”

- Criteria:

Go Local- Awarded to a student who is attending a school/program in Utah next year.

Must specify you are applying for the Oscar Wedegaertner Go Local Scholarship

Oscar Wedegaertner Memorial Scholarship First Generation -1 scholarship for \$3000

“Named for a man who volunteered in all levels of public education: K-college level. To reward outstanding academic achievement”

- Criteria:

First Generation- Awarded to a student who is of the first generation in their family to attend college. May apply even if a sibling or cousin attends college.

Must specify you are applying for the Oscar Wedegaertner First Gen. Scholarship

Painters Scholarship - Number of scholarships and the amount awarded (TBD)

- Criteria: (Flexible)

- Possibly pursuing working in the trades
- Including Individuals who have had to overcome physical, emotional, or learning obstacles.

Park City Artists Scholarship, awarded by Park City Artists Association (PCAA) - 1 scholarship for \$2200

- Criteria:

- Must be entering an art school or college art degree program
- Provide 5 images of your work on a disc for review
- Answer the question, “Why do you want to become a professional artist?”
- Once Awarded Student will provide an interview for a feature on the website



Park City Board of Realtors Philanthropic Foundation – 2 scholarships for \$2,500 each
Application Link - this is the only PCHS scholarship with an outside application!

- Criteria:
 - A student who has not received a scholarship (or enough) for the schools they are applying for to date
 - Good grade point average and involved in the community, well-rounded
 - Demonstrate unique efforts and abilities and possibly not be recognized for those efforts and abilities
 - May have family struggles that could keep them from not being able to attend a college or trade school, i.e. single parent, etc.

Park City PTSO Scholarships – 4 scholarships for \$500 each
(please specify which one you are applying)

1. Ultimate Renaissance Miner, awarded by the PTSO
1 scholarship for \$500

- Criteria:
 - Geared toward the more well-rounded student
 - Applicants must demonstrate academic achievement (GPA, test scores, Honors/AP Classes, etc.)
 - Applicant must demonstrate participation in extracurricular activities i.e. athletics, performing arts, student body, etc., and community service

2. Resilience Award, awarded by the PTSO 1 scholarship for \$500

- Criteria:
 - A student who has experienced hardship or obstacles in their life

3. Greatest Growth, awarded by the PTSO 1 scholarship for \$500

- Criteria:
 - For the student who has grown the most academically (e.g., 2.0 GPA 9th grade to 3.5 GPA 11th grade, 3.8 12th grade)
 - Brief essay: Addressing the above criteria and why are best qualified to receive this scholarship

4. Future Educator Award, awarded by the PTSO 1 scholarship for \$500

- Criteria:
 - A student going on to a Teaching Career
 - Brief Essay: Addressing why you want to go into teaching

Park City High School Alumni Entrepreneur Scholarship – 1 scholarship TBD

- Criteria/ Description:
 - This scholarship is meant for students who take ideas and turn them into action. We are seeking applicants who demonstrate leadership, creativity, and hard work through their personal and community interactions.

Park City Rotary Club – Interact Scholarship – 2-10 scholarships (TBD) worth a total of \$10,000

- Preferably a member of Interact Club - a student who met or exceeded the criteria of community service minimum hours, but will also look at members in other civic organizations/clubs if no Interact Club member applies or fits the criteria.
 - Please tell us your board position in your application.
 - Tell me about 1 meaningful community service/volunteer work and show a desire to continue service

Park City Soccer Club Scholarship – 2 Scholarships for \$1000 each

- Criteria:
 - Describe how club soccer positively influenced your personal growth
 - Describe any ways in which you have volunteered for or contributed to the club
 - Have played at least some of your competitive soccer career with Park City Soccer Club

Parley's Park Elementary Alumni Scholarship - 2 Scholarships for \$1000 each & 2 \$500

- Criteria:
 - Student Graduated from Parleys Park Elementary
 - Include an Essay: How did Parley's Park Elementary impact you? (minimum 500 words) Write about a teacher or experience at Parley's Park Elementary that made a difference in your life. Use specific examples and describe how the person or experience changed your life for the better.

Paul Hewitt Memorial Scholarship – 1 scholarship for \$1000

- Criteria:
 - Interested in pursuing a career in the Emergency Health Field, interest in Public Safety or Health Care.
 - Financial Need

Peg Tan Resilience Scholarship - 1 scholarship for \$1,000

- Criteria:
 - A student overcoming mental health challenges
 - Plan to pursue higher education

RJ Masonry Scholarship Award - 1 scholarship for \$500

- Criteria:
 - Maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher
 - A student who plans to pursue education in construction management or a construction-related field (for example: engineering or architecture) or acquire construction skills in a trade program (masonry, plumbing, electrical, framing, etc.)

Schechinger Family Business/Sales Scholarships – 2 scholarships for \$1,000

This fund was established by Bruce Schechinger and his family, including their mother, Dorothy Schechinger, and his siblings Chris and Robert Jr, to honor the legacy of Robert Carl Schechinger, a lifetime business executive. "Bob" was employed by the Dupont Chemical Company, specializing in the apparel sector. During that time, he spent 3 years living abroad in Tehran to help establish a textile plant. He was also instrumental for The Milliken Company and their "Made in the USA" campaign.

Bob was very involved with the sales and marketing aspect of the business. He assisted in identifying special needs for their business segment to grow. Lycra was one of the most successful products Dupont developed under his responsibility.

- Criteria:
 - Minimum GPA 3.2
 - Must plan to attend college in the fall of 2024
 - Must have financial need

Shaw Design Creativity Scholarship - 1 scholarship for \$1500

- Criteria:
 - Plan on pursuing a “creative” field in college. eg: visual or performing arts, interior design, architecture, photography, graphic design, etc.
 - Please submit a creative sample to Pepper Elliot in the counseling office
 - Awarded to a student who displays creativity in any form

Sylvia Kuhlman Wright Scholarship - 1 scholarship for \$1,000

- Criteria:
 - Female Graduating Student

Tanner A. Stratton Memorial Scholarship – 1 Scholarship \$1,000

Tanner Alan Stratton was a 2018 graduate of Park City High School. He earned his private pilot license and a degree in Aviation Science from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University in Prescott Arizona in 2022. Tanner was hooked on flying after his first flight. He was passionate about flying and was an active member of the aviation community. Tanner was a caring, generous human being who passed away too young at the age of 22.

- **Criteria:**
 - GPA: 3.0 or higher
 - Essay: 300 words or more on your current involvement in the aviation community, goals, and a personal statement about your passion for aviation and how a degree in Aviation Science will benefit the aviation community.

Park City Utah Bar Association’s Legal Studies Scholarship – 2 Scholarships for \$1000

- Criteria:
 - A student planning on a legal career/pursuing legal and/or political science

The Park City LGBTQ+ Taskforce Inclusivity Scholarship - 1 scholarship for \$500

- The Park City LGBTQ+ Taskforce Inclusivity Scholarship will be awarded to a student who has achieved demonstrable deeds and actions that enhance the practice or policy of providing equal access to opportunities and resources for people who might otherwise be excluded or marginalized, such as those individuals who are part of the GSA of Park City High School.
 - Please write an essay of 1000 words or less describing how you have been an advocate for inclusivity in Park City High School.

The Madison DeCamp Equality Scholarships – 1 scholarship \$2,000

The Madison DeCamp Equality Scholarship is presented to a student who embraces and embodies equality, inclusion, and kindness through word and deed toward all students. Please highlight any work you have done to create a more inclusive, environment for the LGBTQ+ community. Some consideration for academic achievement and financial need.

- Criteria:
 - Applicants must express via a brief essay (300-1000 words) their experience, beliefs, and values as it pertains to their involvement in the LGBTQ+ Community

The UPS Stores Park City, Giauque Family - 1 scholarship for \$1,500

- Criteria: (Flexible)
 - General application

The Randy Spagnoletti Scholarship – 2 Scholarships for \$2500

- Criteria:
 - Students attending or planning to attend a trade school

The Ryan Mitchell Memorial Music Scholarship – 1 Scholarship of \$2000

“Established to honor Ryan’s memory and his dedication, passion, and love of music, especially jazz”

- Criteria:
 - Attending college to pursue a music degree or a career in music
 - Demonstrated a commitment to studying and playing music, including extracurricular activity



Trade School & PCCAPS Scholarships – 2 Scholarships for \$1,000 each

Criteria:

- 1 scholarship for a student heavily involved in the PCCAPS program
 - 1 scholarship for a student planning to pursue a trade (firefighter, automotive, electrician, etc.)

Trailside Elementary PTO Scholarship

1 scholarship \$500

- Criteria:
 - Student Graduated from Trailside Elementary
 - Write an essay (min. 500 words) about a teacher or experience at Trailside Elementary School that made a difference in your life. Use specific examples and describe how that Trailside person or event changed your life for the better. Make sure to edit your work carefully. Judges will not consider essays with excessive grammar, spelling, or punctuation errors.

- Criteria:

"Open to any senior interested in majoring in music or music education"

- Preference is given to a Jazz Band student interested in majoring in and studying music in college
 - A student who exhibits a passion for music

Women's Inspired Network (WIN) Park City– 2-6 scholarships \$2,000

- Criteria:
 - For a female student who displays leadership qualities in their studies or sports
 - Has a *high financial need* to pay for college
 - Participates in part-time work
 - Has participated in community service or volunteer activities

Youth Sports Alliance Stein Eriksen Merit Scholarship 1 scholarship for \$3,000

- Criteria:
 - 3.5 GPA or higher
 - 3 of the last 4 years in a YSA member program / Figure Skating of Park City / PC Ice Miners / PC Ski & Snowboard / PC Speed Skating Club / Wasatch Luge / Wasatch Freestyle Foundation / Utah Olympic Park Bobsled Skeleton
