

First Meeting of the Year: First meeting will tentatively be 8/5/2024. Time to be determined. Instructional Goal Focus and Retreat: Some ideas are structural changes to advisory. Possibility for retreat. Science: Concerns about the beginning of the school year and chromebook distribution. Need to avoid issues from the beginning 				

		of this year. Considering new cell phone policy, we need to ensure students have other devices ready on day one. Idea proposed to have a chromebook distribution day. Volunteers would be needed. Freshman on Soar Day. Every student should have them by the 9th. Freshman/Sophomore in the morning Juniors/Seniors in the afternoon. Possibly Student Senators could help? English: Concerns about school culture. Phone usage, attendance issues around vacations and other absences. Academic honesty related to AI. Concerns about the physical environment of the school. At the beginning of school year building school culture. Concerns about grounds maintenance. Concerns about adult communication and cooperation and how this models behaviors for students. Students feel overall positive about school culture. Admin suggests idea of implementing more community service. Science, points out that there has been different cycles of respect/disrespect and an aspect of this is students holding themselves accountable. MCL: Idea about looking at what other schools are doing, what schools are finding success in different policies. Admin reiterates that expectations for Tardies, Cell Phones etc. will begin on a stronger foot at the beginning of the next school year. MCL: More visibility of teachers could help deter some of these behaviors.

Figuring out ways to help with funding for Culinary. ■ Counseling: Will look at changes and understand how to support students and teachers in having students complete high school. ■ Fine Arts: What are Admin's priority on AP classes? Scheduling can provide challenges with upper level arts classes. Support in helping students pay their fees. Admin: There is a fund to help in some situations with fees. ■ Special Ed: Future depends on SAT process. ■ Social Studies: Adjusting for new requirements. Possibly shifting EHS towards a Social Studies/Humanities Magnet School.
