#### A MESSAGE FROM MS. SAINFLEUR AND MISS TYRRELL SECOND GRADE

Welcome Spring! We are heading into the last marking period of the school year! In ECRI, we are learning new trick words, reviewing affixes, and continuing to work on writing and marking up double vowel words. In Wonders, we are finishing Unit 5 focusing on asking and answering questions, finding key details in a text, finding different points of view in a story, rereading, visualizing and summarizing what we are reading about. In Math, we are learning about measurement! The students will be learning how to use different units of measurement, such as: centimeters, inches, and feet. They will also be learning how to estimate different lengths. We are still adding and subtracting three-digit numbers by using strategies such as place value, expanded form and open number lines. In Science, we will be starting our next unit on Matter. Students are working daily on completing their iReady Math and Amplify Reading lessons. Please make sure to check your child's blue folder.

Our students are working super hard and we are so proud of all of them! Keep it up 2nd Grade!

#### A MESSAGE FROM MR. MITCHELL AND MRS. SCHMIED THIRD GRADE

Spring Happiness to all of our Third Grade families. We are so happy that the nicer weather is here. Just a reminder that all homework is assigned on Mondays and due on Fridays.

A Reading Note from Mrs. Schmied: We are starting the 4th marking period. It is extremely important that children get their assignments done and handed in on time. We are starting Unit 5, Take Action, in Wonders. During this five week unit, students will explore the big idea of Taking Action. Students will have essential questions that will guide them through each lesson. The overarching essential question is "What are ways people can take actions?". In Fundations we are reviewing double vowel teams, contractions using not and is and the difference between hard and soft c/g. Fluency practice is also important to keep working on at home. Students should read aloud the passages in their fluency folders every night.

We are continuing to practice for Smarter Balance Testing. You can practice with your children at home.

A Math Note from Mr. Mitchell: During the fourth marking period our students will be learning all about measurement and geometry. In April, they will learn how to measure with a ruler and then graph the data on line plots. Students will then learn about time, liquid volume, and mass. In addition, we will review concepts to prepare for the Smarter Balance and i-Ready End-of-Year Assessments coming in May. Please keep practicing multiplication facts through  $10 \times 10$ .



#### A MESSAGE FROM MRS. BETANCOURT AND MR. WELCH FOURTH GRADE

Hi everyone! It's hard to believe that we are already in the fourth marking period and that the school year is almost over! Even though it's almost summer, we still want your children to challenge themselves to be the best they can be. Here are a few updates about what we are working on in April along with some ways you can help your children succeed.

In ELA, both classes are learning about how to do research and use different sources when writing about a topic. We are also getting ready for the Smarter Balanced test, which will take place in May. It is important to read with your child and ask them questions every night!

In math, students are working on a unit on fractions and decimals, which will continue through all of April. As always, PLEASE make sure you are practicing basic math facts with your children. Fact fluency is very important!

Finally, in science students wrapped up a unit on natural hazards, such as: hurricanes, tsunamis, and volcanoes. They are now learning about the earth and how weathering, erosion, and deposition can change the Earth's surface.

#### A MESSAGE FROM MR. PEREZ PHYSICAL EDUCATION TEACHER

Happy Spring! Students are excited to be outdoors for Physical Education. During this month the students will be working on the following:

Grades K-2: Balance /Coordination- Balance is a great way to help the body recognize where it is and how to move around in an area. Balancing activities increases a child's endurance and core strength. This enables children to process visual information to control their hands, helping them to write or catch a ball, which is essential for fine motor skills.

Grade 3-5: They will learn about tennis history, parts of the racket, and the different tennis strokes for beginners like the serve, forehand, and backhand. Below are several goals they will be progressing towards.

- Tap a ball or balloon up 5 consecutive times.
- Bump down the ball or balloon and catch it against my racket 5 consecutive times.
- Underhand the backhand and forehand skills and strike a ball with my racket against a wall in a controlled manner.
- Two-hand volley with control with a partner.
