Grade 4: Grade 4 will be building our STEAM contraptions next week. Students will present their projects after April vacation. In math, students are making equivalent fractions through multiplying and dividing.

Grade 5: Fifth graders have finished their learning of multiplication of fractions. Next week, students will move on to learning about division of fractions. Students have been working hard on their zoo opinion essays.

Grade 6: Sixth graders are excited to have their science fair projects determined. Next week, they will be writing their first three introductory paragraphs to their lab reports and will feel a big sense of relief when they are completed before break!

CSDA Unified Arts: In the library, students are learning how to develop great "open" essential questions and tying them into thesis statements for their research unit. Students are also getting close to the end of the read-alouds!!

RMMS Happenings

Pre-K: Preschoolers will explore the topic of dinosaurs next week. They will make fossils and do a dinosaur dig.

Grade K: Kindergarteners will be continuing to read and spell words with consonant digraphs. Additionally, they will "scoop" sentences as they work to chunk texts into natural phrases.

Grade 1: First graders will celebrate their fabulous earth in honor of Earth Day. They will begin Topic 5 in math, which focuses on balanced equations and those with three addends.

Grade 2: Next week, second graders will wrap up their study of geometry in math. They will also be reading poetry and working with the ai and ay vowel teams in Fundations.

Grade 3: Next week, third graders are finishing nonfiction research projects and continuing practice with equivalent fractions. In science, they are learning about life cycles in honor of Earth Month.

RMMS Unified Arts: April is a busy month in the library! Grades 2 & 3 are learning about poetry and its many forms. They will also become poets themselves when they try their hand at BIO poems and Acrostic poems. Grades K & 1 are discussing the roles and responsibilities of authors and illustrators. Each day we are reading a book with words and reading a book without words!

Spring Health Tips

Move more, Sit less-Eat healthy foods-Choose water over sugary drinks-Get enough sleep-Be sun safe-Brush your teeth-Don't use tobacco products-Learn your health history

DID YOU KNOW?

Children aged 6 to 12 need 9-12 hours of sleep per night. Teens 13 to 18 need 8-10 hours of sleep per night.

ILLNESS CIRCULATING

<u>Pink Eye (Conjunctivitis)</u> If your child has red eyes with drainage, please have them seen by the doctor to determine treatment needed. 24 hours of treatment required before returning to school. Wash hands frequently.

Strep Throat If your child has a sore throat this can be diagnosed with a rapid strep test or throat culture. If diagnosed with strep throat, your child must be fever free and on antibiotics for a minimum of 12-24 hours before returning to school. Throw out your toothbrush after 24 hours of antibiotics and sanitize your water bottle each day while being treated.

Stomach Illness Nausea and Vomiting. Stay home until there is no vomiting for 24 hours and be able to keep food down.

COVID UPDATES: EFFECTIVE 3/1/24

- Isolation is no longer required
- Positive Covid person should stay at home and away from others until they are at least 24 hours with symptoms getting better
- Fever free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications
- After this 24 hours, it is recommended to wear a well fitting mask for 5 days when around others


