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Happy Spring! Even though our unseasonable winter disappointed those who look forward to the occasional 'snow day', the weather helped us string together several weeks of high-quality student learning across Mankato Area Public Schools (MAPS). As we head into the final stretch of the 2023-2024 school year, the MAPS staff is focused on a strong finish this June and has started planning for the future of our schools.

What does it mean to be a 'future-focused' school district? This question is at the heart of the strategic planning process that MAPS has embarked on over the last 18 months. Students, staff, families, and community leaders provided input about what students need in their daily experiences at school as we prepare them for their future.

The planning process we've embarked on is called Classroom to Boardroom, and that title appropriately positions our focus on what happens at the classroom level every day. By far, the most important influence on student learning in school is teacher effectiveness. Of course, several factors impact student learning, including physical, social and emotional well-being, curriculum, and interpersonal relationships, but none of these compare to having high-quality teachers working with students daily. MAPS is fortunate and extremely proud to have a teaching staff that is among the best in the state.

By centering the student experience at the classroom level, and then engaging with staff and families to collect their input about how to improve the system, school leaders have built theories of action that, when implemented, will result in meeting the expectations of our public school stakeholders. Throughout the Classroom to Boardroom process, district leaders and school board members have learned a lot about the hopes and dreams of our kids, staff and parents. The perspectives shared with us have made it clear that the MAPS system needs to respond more rapidly to the changing needs of those we serve.

Soon, the MAPS School Board will be sharing revisions to the school district's strategic roadmap which includes the vision, mission, core commitments and strategic priorities that will guide MAPS' work over the next several years. When you see or hear about what is being proposed, please share your feedback. We value your input and look forward to our work together on behalf of our greatest community asset-our kids!



Groundbreaking ceremonies are scheduled between April and May for the remaining three sites, indicating a phased approach to construction and development.
