He is undecided on a college but is considering the University of Texas where he will major in finance or become a medical professional.


Jesus Muniz, his senior Spanish teacher is Nithin's favorite teacher.

Antonio wants to be an accountant or financial manager, and plans to attend the University of Texas Permian Basin.



He plans to study physiology at the University of Texas Permian Basin.


Said's favorite teacher is PHS social studies teacher Samuel Valerio.

He placed in the state Speech competition, is on the A-Honor Roll, and earned medals in Academic Decathlon.




Carlos's favorite teacher is 10th grade history teacher Brandon Cook.

He will attend Columbia University, with a goal of publishing research while in college.


Gabriel selected English teacher David Newman as his favorite teacher.

Mason plans to major in finance and minor in music. He will attend Baylor University.


He chose Jeb Harris, assistant choir director at PHS, as his favorite teacher.
