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| <p>Mellessa Brenem, Permian Basin Regional Counsel on Alcohol and Drug Abuse - Impact Youth</p> | <p>Online presentation. 2018 Texas School Survey data from two ECISD schools (7th & 8th grade students) indicates that alcohol and substance use is higher in ECISD than the state average.</p> <p>Universal Youth Program - Too Good for Drugs (2G4D): targets all 6th grade students in district. Partner requested assistance signing schools up to participate.</p> |
| <p>Gaby Spurger, Crisis Center of West Texas: Healthy Relationships, Expect Respect Program</p> | <p>Healthy Relationships is a 9 week program on healthy relationships for middle & high school students available in English and Spanish.</p> <p>Expect Respect is geared to at risk youth at school's request. Supports students who have experienced violence or abuse, are involved in an unhealthy relationship, use alcohol or drugs, or are pregnant. Partner has made 3-4 presentations in the district this year.</p> |
| <p>Carrie Bronaugh, Harmony Home: Child Safety Matters</p> | <p>Prevention program is split into two lessons, of 45 mins to 1 hour each that addresses all types of child abuse, bullying, cyberbullying, and digital dangers. 13 schools and ~6,000 students have participated this year.</p> |
| <p>Jumon Hailey, Life Center: Human Growth And Development</p> | <p>Prevention Education Program educates on the topic of sexual risk avoidance. Program is for grades 4-12, with each program laying the foundation for more in depth topics to help students make positive decisions for their physical, emotional and mental health.</p> |
| <p>Lisa Platner, Texas Tech University Health Science Center: Human Growth and Development</p> | <p>Presenter not in attendance. Gracie Flores provided overview, indicated that they cover similar topics as Life Center - sexual health and wellness and risk avoidance. This partner provides medically based information to middle and high school students. Presenters are volunteers from the medical field, such as med. students, med. residents, and nurses.</p> <p>This partner works through the counselor in order to schedule presentations. *All 10th graders have completed a one time session with the exception of Ector.</p> |
