Valentine's Day Facts

Although the name is Saint Valentine's Day, most people refer to the day as Valentine's Day. It was originally a day to celebrate Saint Valentinus, who performed weddings for soldiers who were not allowed to marry, and later sent to prison for doing so. Saint Valentinus wrote a letter to the daughter of his jailer before he was executed. His letter was signed 'From your Valentine'. He was buried on February 14th. Valentine's Day was not associated with romantic love until the middle ages. By the 1700s in England it began to resemble the Valentine's Day we know today. At this time people began to express their love with gifts of flowers, candy and cards, which were called 'valentines'.

Interesting Facts:

- -On Valentine's Day every year, there are at least 36 million heart shaped boxes of chocolates sold.
- -There are enough candy hearts made each year to stretch from Valentine, Arizona to Rome, Italy, and back again. The number of these candy hearts produced is approximately 8 billion.
- -There are approximately 50 million roses given on Valentine's Day around the world.
- -There are approximately 1 billion Valentine`s Day cards exchanged every year in the U.S. alone.

-Every Valentine's Day, the Italian city of Verona receives approximately 1,000 letters that have been addressed to Juliet. This is where Romeo and Juliet, the young lovers in Shakespeare's play, lived.

- -At least 9 million people buy their pets a gift on Valentine's Day.
- -After St. Valentine was buried, Julia, the daughter of his jailor, planted an almond tree with pink blossoms near his grave. The almond tree today is a symbol of lasting friendship and love.

TOPIC: Dating and Relationships can be

difficult at any age. Building and maintaining healthy relationships is often a skill we build over time, developing as we grow and learn more about ourselves and others. Specifically, the added stress of surging hormones, peer pressure, and rapid life changes places teens at a higher risk of being in unhealthy relationships. There are a lot of things that feel scary and overwhelming when you are a teenager; your relationship should not be one of them.

Common red flags in teen relationships:

- Excessive jealousy, possessiveness, or repeated false accusations that a partner is cheating.
- Tracking/controlling social media usage, strict rules for what a partner can/cannot post or view.
- Pressuring, coercing, manipulating, or forcing a partner into sexual acts.
- Physical violence (hitting, punching, slapping, kicking, spitting.)
- Threatening to 'out' or expose an LGBTQ+ partner to humiliate them.
- Isolation from family, friends, and other trusted sources.
- Demanding that a partner dress, look, or act a certain way.
- Purposely hurting a partner's feelings, exploiting their insecurities, or constantly blaming them for everything.
- Manipulating facts and distorting the truth to make a partner question their sanity and values. (Also referred to as 'gaslighting.')

There are a lot of abusive behaviors that teens may experience every day. Sometimes, we do not realize that a relationship was abusive until after we have left it. Keeping an eye out for red flags is extremely important, but it is also good to check in every now and then to make sure your relationship stays healthy. Some clever ways to check in with yourself include:

- Asking yourself...
 - o Does this person make me feel good about myself?
 - o Do I feel supported by this person?
 - o Do I always feel safe with this person?
 - o Can I be completely myself with this person?
 - Does this person treat me as an equal?
