

Bilingual Parent Advisory Council (BPAC)

The Bilingual Parent Advisory Council (BPAC) is an advocate for excellence in all programs serving English learners. BPAC provides family support, communication, and information that enables students to become bilingual, bi-literate, and bi-cultural. The committee is comprised of parents of children in the Dual Language/ English Learner programs, district staff members, and interested community members. Committee members participate in the planning, operation, and evaluation of the programs, as well as the review of the district's annual application to the Illinois State Board of Education.

Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC)

PT3 increases transparency of special education services by promoting awareness of school programs, recognizing accomplishments, identifying future needs, and fostering collaboration as a means to develop trust and understanding between parents and educators.


