We are pleased to announce that based on this feedback and careful consideration, the St. Helens School District will be implementing a new schedule for school start and end times for the upcoming academic year.

Here are the revised start and end times for our schools:

- · Columbia City Elementary: 7:45 am 2:15 pm
- · Lewis & Clark Elementary: 7:45 am 2:15 pm
- McBride Elementary: 7:45 am 2:15 pm
- St. Helens High School: 8:20 am 3:20 pm
- St. Helens Middle School: 8:30 am 3:00 pm

This updated schedule not only reflects our commitment to optimizing learning opportunities for our students but also aligns with recommendations from the American Academy of Pediatrics. Research indicates that older students benefit from later start times, promoting academic success and overall mental well-being. Conversely, for our younger students, earlier start times have been shown to have no measurable negative impact on academic outcomes.

We are confident that these adjustments will contribute to a more conducive learning environment for all our students, enabling them to thrive academically, emotionally, and socially.
