going and how it can improve.

One MYP project that made a big impact on the world took place in Puerto Rico. A group of students helped rebuild multiple dwellings after a dan-gerous storm. Some things they helped rebuild were schools and homes. Here at SMS, many students have very unique ideas! My group, which also in-cludes Terezina Parubi and Morgan Sabanosh, is working toward helping kids learn sports and exposing them to new ones. Our idea was a group effort

and came from our common love of all different sports.m We have begun to organize our project. Sometime in early May, we will host a volleyball and basketball clinic for any children (between 1st and 4th grade) who would like to attend. It would cost \$20 per child. The money that is paid goes directly to a PE program at a Charter School in Mount Vernon NY.

Sports to the Max: 2023 NY Jets Season Review

Going into this season, the Jets had just finished their 2022 season with a 7-10 Saleh and 4th year General Manager Joe Douglas. In the 2022 Draft the Jets drafted Ohio State wide receiver Garrett Wilson and

Cincinnati cornerback Sauce Gardener in the 1st round. Those two rookies would win both Offensive and Defense Rookies of the Year.

Another notable selection in that year's draft for the Jets was Iowa State run-ning back Breece Hall in the 2^{nd} round, who has proven to be a dynamic offensive weapon for the Jets with his explosive ability

when he touches the ball.

With management having seen enough from 2^{nd} year Quarterback and former #2 overall pick in the 2021 draft Zach Wilson, the Jets made a block-buster trade. The Jets were able to trade for fourtime MVP quarterback Aaron Rodgers from the Green Bay Packers. The trade shocked the NFL community and sent Jets fans into a frenzy. They finally had a great quarterback to complement their ferocious defense.

In the first round of the 2023 draft, the Jets drafted defensive end Will McDonald from Iowa State. With Rodgers as the starter, the potential for this Jets team seemed infinite, but the hype would turn into disappointment fast. Week 1 was a Monday Night Football Game between the Jets and their longtime

division rivals, the Buffalo Bills at home. The Jets won in Overtime 22-16 off a Xavier Gipson punt return touchdown. The Jets defense played great, sacking Josh Allen 5 times, intercepting him 3 times and recovering a fumble.

On the first Jets offensive drive, Aaron Rodgers tore his Achilles tendon and was ruled out. Backup Zach Wilson came in and tossed

140 yards and a TD to help the Jets get the win and start 1-0 for the first time since 2018

The rest of the Jets' season would be more bumpy than smooth. Zach Wilson was named the starter for the rest of the season, and after the magical win against the Bills, the Jets would drop their next three games to fall to 1-3 with a blowout loss on the road in Dallas and 2 close home losses to the rival New England Patriots and Defending Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs despite a strong performance from Zach Wilson.

The next three weeks would be better for the Jets, as they went 3-0 beating the Denver Broncos on the road, beating the undefeated Philadelphia Eagles at home, and after coming off their bye week, they beat my New York Giants in overtime in MetLife Stadium to improve to 4-3. Unfortunately for the Jets, the next five weeks were

Unfortunately for the Jets, the next five weeks were very rough as they had 5 consecutive losses. The first was a blowout home loss to the Los Angeles Chargers in a 6-27 loss. The next was a low scoring, mistake-filled 12-16 loss against the Las Vegas Raiders. The game after that was yet another blowout loss on the road against the Bills in a 6-32 loss. The next game was a blowout home loss on Black Friday to the Miami Dolphins in a 13-34 loss. The last of the five losses was at home against the Atlanta Falcons where the Jets lost 8-13. The Jets were now 4-8 and eliminated from AFC East Contention.

Zach Wilson was put back into the starting lineup and threw for 300 yards and 2 touchdowns in a 30-6 blowout win over the Houston Texans at home. With the Jets at 5-8, they traveled to Miami and got destroyed as they lost 30-0 in yet ANOTHER blowout loss. This put the Jets at 5-9 and eliminated them from playoff contention altogether. Wilson suffered a concussion in the game and was ruled out for the rest of the season. QB Trevor Siemian was then named the starter for the rest of the season.

The next game was at home against the league worst Washington Commanders defense and the Jets won 30-28, putting them at 6-9. Their second to last game was against the playoff-bound Cleveland Browns in Cleveland. The Jets lost 37-20 to their former QB, Joe Flacco, as the Jets finished with yet another 10+ loss season, their ninth of such since they last made the playoffs all the way back in 2010.

The Jets ended their season against the 4-12 Patriots on the road in Foxborough, which would turn out to be Bill Belichick's last game as Patriots head coach. The Jets beat the Pats 17-3 and matched their record from the previous season at 7-10.

son at 7-10. My analysis for this team is simple. This Jets team can be incredibly good if they can get Aaron Rodgers back healthy in 2024. The Jets defense is one of the best units in the league. They finished 2023 with the 12th best ranked scoring defense in the league, allowed the 2nd fewest passing yards, 4th fewest passing touchdowns, and the 8th most interceptions. The defense accumulated 17 interceptions, 10 recovered fumbles, 90 pass deflections, and 48 sacks. They also had two all pros on the defense, Quinnen Williams and Sauce Gardner. They also scored three defensive touchdowns and had a safety. The lots offense, though is terrible, to put it picely

The Jets offense, though, is terrible, to put it nicely. They had the 30th fewest passing yards, and were dead last in passing touchdowns, 22nd in rushing yards, and 30th in rushing touchdowns. That does not mean they did not have some bright spots though. Breece Hall, in his second season, was six yards shy of 1000 yards on the year and had 1600 scrimmage yards and nine total touchdowns. Second year receiver Garrett Wilson had 95 catches for 1042 yards and three touchdowns. And tight end Tyler Conklin and 61 catches for 621 yards.

In the offseason, the Jets should find Rodgers a good #2 and #3 receiver. A solid backup RB also could not hurt the Jets. The Jets should also look to resign double digit sack man Bryce Huff as well. Good Luck Gang Green next season! The Tusker Tribune The Student Newspaper of Somers Middle School
