dents were searching all over their closets for anything close to neon and rainbow. In the end the hallways were filled with bright clothing! Culture Day was on
















This Week In History

Have you ever wondered what happened today ten years ago? Twenty years ago? Fifty? In *This Week in History*, I will tell you about the events that happened that particular week that could have impacted our everyday lives or are just really interesting to

learn about.





 $m March~21^{st}, 1918$

The infamous battle of the Somme began on this date, beginning with German General Erich von Ludendorff commencing a strenuous attack that would help the Germans win the war once and for all. The attack started with a *five hour* artillery barrage followed by a flow of German troops. The battle lasted until April 6th. The Germans gained about 35 miles of territory, and the German and allied casualty figures was almost 500,000.

 $\mathbf{March~22^{nd},~1972}$

On this date. the Equal Rights Amendment to the United States Constitution was passed by senate, and then sent to the States for ratification. It stated that, "Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex", and that "Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article." Twenty two of the required thirty-eight states ratified the amendment right away, however conflict arose about concerns that women would be subject to the draft and duty in combat. The proposed amendment finally failed in 1982 after it was short of three states to get the required thirty-eight to ratify the law.






March 23rd, 1775

American Patriot Patrick Henry gave an inspiring speech on this date that put hope in the American people before the Virginia convention in the state's capital. A famous line from this speech is, "I know not what course others may take; but as for me, give me liberty, or give me death!".

March 24th, 1934
The Philippines were granted independence from the United States by President Franklin D. Roosevelt. The Philippines were islands in the South Pacific that had been under American control for almost fifty years.

This year I feel that Duke has a very good chance of winning, especially since Zion Williams is back. The other night they played UNC and were down the whole game but came back and won by 1




Duke point. Zion had 31 points on Saturday.
