### **An Overview of PRHS:**

The mission of the Pine-Richland School District is to focus on learning for every student every day.



- Grades **9-12**

- Typical day: 8 Class Periods & Lunch
- Over **120** teachers and staff and comprehensive supports for you.



## **PRHS Scheduling Timeline**

January 29-February 2	PRMS teachers share course recommendations w/students
February 1	Choosing Wisely parent presentation (6:00pm)
February 8	Principals Advisory Committee & Peer2Peer students will visit you
February 12	Grades 8 - 11: Students will receive core academic course requests and informational letters via the Community Web Portal (Sapphire) - Due Feb. 16
February 21-March 13	Counselors meet w/students to confirm scheduling choices
March 15	Students receive verification forms via Community Web Portal (Sapphire). Students and parents are asked to verify only that the courses showing match their original course request form Due March 21

There will be additional opportunities for learning more about PRHS between now and next year!



### Life at Pine-Richland High School:

- 8 period school day plus lunch
- Class periods are 42 minutes long
- Students are assigned to a locker with a combination lock and keep the same locker for four years
- Students are assigned to a homeroom and keep the same homeroom for four years

#### Recommendations are based on:

- Academic performance while considering your attendance and work ethic
- Course prerequisites as defined in the PRHS 2024-2025 Program of Studies



- Students will receive their Course Request Forms in the Community
   Web Portal on Monday, February 12
  - Be sure to review/discuss these with your family!
- Review the **Program of Studies** and choose electives:
  - Electives MUST be documented on the scheduling form
  - All elective choices MUST also have an alternate option
  - Please note that students may not use the same alternate for all elective choices, nor can they use a first choice elective as an alternate.



 Students may STEP DOWN in a class on the scheduling form

(example: Honors to Academic)

Students may NOT STEP UP using the scheduling form

(example: Academic to Honors)

- This will require a Waiver Form (in Sapphire)
- The Waiver Form MUST be submitted with the scheduling form
- Please review *Waiver Guidelines and Requirements*



All forms **MUST** be **SIGNED** by parent/guardian and **submitted** in the Community Web Portal by

### Friday, February 16th



Students need to complete these forms to meet with their counselor and develop a 4- year plan of studies.



- Review the 2024-2025 PRHS
   Program of Studies
- Talk over your choices with your family
- Plan elective courses prior to the assigned scheduling day
- Plan Alternate Choices for each elective
- Come to scheduling prepared with questions you may have for counselors
  - Write them down WITH your parents





- We cannot honor requests for the following:
  - A specific teacher
  - A specific lunch period
  - A specific period for a class/study hall





The Master Schedule is built from the course requests you make now.

Choices made now will help to ensure that you see your requests or alternates on next year's schedule.

**Schedule changes are** <u>NOT</u> **made over the summer**, and there is no guarantee that you will be able to change your schedule at the start of the next school year.

### **Honors English 9**

- Prerequisite: Completion of English 8 with a 90% or higher and Teacher Recommendation.
- Summer Reading is required

### Language Arts 9

Summer Reading is required



## Math Department

### Placement is determined by previous course

- Concepts of Mathematics
- Algebra 1
- Algebra 1 with lab
- Geometry
- Geometry with lab
- Honors Geometry
- Algebra 2
- Algebra 2 with lab
- Honors Algebra 2

In order to take an honors level course, students must have a 90% average in their current regular education course or an 80% in an honors level course. Teacher recommendation is also required.




