Create a soundtrack with 10 popular songs to go with your novel. 1. Select 10 songs that you feel represent the various literary elements of the novel. 2. Create a playlist with explanations See template HERE.	Students will select one character from the story they chose to read and create a cotton t-shirt. See instructions HERE.	Students will create a triarama of their novel. Each of the following should be included: - Plot - Setting - Characters Students will attach 3-5 sentence explanations for each side and attach. Character Project/ Mind Bend	Book Brochure	Cereal Box Report	
Students will create a character analysis project on their favorite character from the book they read. Click here to access the template and instructions.	Students will create a book brochure to illustrate the development of plot in your chosen novel. Click here to see template and examples.	Students will creatively decorate a real cereal box with illustrations and information related to the book they read including characters, setting, vocabulary, and a short summary. Collage	Book in a Box	One Pager Project	
Students will create a collage to represent one of the characters in the story. Then, provide a 8-10 sentence explanation of the character/collage. Click here to see examples.	Students will keep track of important ideas, thoughts, questions, and words while reading their self-selected book. Students will then take that information to decorate a box to represent the book and fill it with objects (5 minimum) that represent different parts of the book. English I, English II, English III Honors, English IV Honors ONLY

You will write 10 questions you have for two characters in the story. You will "interview" the character and create their responses based on what you learn about the characters' thoughts, emotions, actions, etc.

Graphic Novel: Comic Strip

Change the genre of the book by creating a comic strip that includes a minimum of 8 events and 32 frames.

Script Writing

Write a play based on the novel read. Students can choose to turn the novel into a play and write the script or write a sequel to the novel in the form of a play.

Postcards

Students will create five postcards coming from one or more of the characters. On the back of each postcard, write a short summary of an important event from the story. On the front, illustrate that event.

Newspaper

Students will read a book and then create a two-page newspaper complete with a main event lead news story, character profile, editorial book review, setting highlight, and even a comic, obituary or advice column.

Character Journal

Create a diary written from a character's perspective.

- Write a minimum of two paragraphs for each entry. Write a minimum of 10 journal entries as if you were the character. Make sure to date your entries.
- *Include events from the story and the character's feelings about those events*

Book Map (Ideal for Non-fiction)

Create a collection of maps that reference important locations in the book. You can create a poster or digital map. Be sure to illustrate and label key locations/events.

ABC Book Project

You will create an alphabet book. Each letter in the alphabet will be a word, character, or vocabulary word that relates to the novel you chose. You will also include a description for each (3-5 sentences and illustrate it)

You will write a well-developed analytical essay examining plot, setting, characters, point of view, figurative language, and style of the text.

Text evidence must be embedded and cited.
