MILLFIELD'S WINDMILL HISTORY



History of Millfield School's Coat of Arms

Millfield School's Coat of Arms were granted on 9 September 1954. The school motto, Molire Molendo, means to achieve by grinding. This is also a play on words, as a mill achieves by grinding and pupils at a school achieve by hard work.

Official Blazon

Vert, the Sails of a Windmill saltirewise, between four crosses Bottonnée Argent. And for the Crest, on a wreath argent and azure on a Mount vert a windmill gules between two bunches of Hawthorn proper.

Translation

On a green background, the sails of a windmill in white (silver) arranged as an X. In the gaps between four crosses with 'Ace of Clubs' tips also in white. The crest (on top of the helmet) a 'wreath' in blue & white, on top of that a green mound and on top of that a Windmill in red. The windmill is framed by two sprigs of hawthorn in flower in natural colours.

Mill Field House was the existing property on the piece of land rented to Jack Meyer by the Clark Family, who were Quakers. The current School Chemistry Department, situated on one of the highest points in Street, was the original location for the Windmill situated on the land rented by Boss, the School Founder.



This section of the map was dated 1548, Windmill on the top left.
