### Senior Majors

#### Art- Maryland, My Maryland

Celebrate Maryland and the Chesapeake through art! Artists will engage with a variety of mediums and use found objects such as sea glass and oyster shells to create projects that feature the Maryland Flag, and display all of your projects in a self-decorated crab basket!

#### Art- A Day at the Beach

Artists will create a variety of works inspired by the beach and ocean: sculpt ocean inspired clay creatures (fish, octopus, or imaginary creatures from the deep); paint landscape and seascape glass bottles; and create glass, shell, and driftwood suncatchers.

#### Dance

This class will begin with basic stretching techniques that will improve flexibility. Technique such as turns, jumps, kicks, and leaps will be practiced daily. A dance routine will be taught and performed at the end of week showcase. Students will also have time to collaborate to choreograph their own dance pieces.

#### Drama

Develop your skills and knowledge of acting while enjoying drama activities and preparing a brief performance for the end of the week. This class is appropriate for students who have a strong interest in drama (acting) and will cover the concepts needed to prepare a solid performance.

#### Music-Senior Band\*

Students will rehearse a variety of songs that encompass styles from classic band literature to pop tunes and will perform at the camp concert. Additionally, we will practice in small ensembles, play musical games, compose our own music and learn basic conducting skills. Students must provide their own instrument; students who use a school instrument during the school year ask your band teacher about using a school instrument during Summer Arts Academy.

#### Music- Senior Orchestra\*

Calling all string players! Do you play the violin, viola, cello or string bass? Join the Senior Summer Arts Academy Orchestra. The orchestra major will focus on increasing musicianship and instrumental skills. Students will learn these skills through a variety of music as well as games and musical activities. We will perform at the concert on the last day of camp. Students must provide their own instrument; string bass players and students who use a school instrument during the school year should ask their orchestra teacher about using a school instrument during Summer Arts Academy.'

\*Prerequisite: Students must have one year of successful experience on their instrument

## Senior Morning Minors

### **Art- Jewelry Making**

Baubles, Bangles, and Beads! Students will have the opportunity to craft a variety of jewelry items with different materials. Materials may include but are not limited to beading, wire, clay, and other traditional and non-traditional materials.

### **Art- Gyotaku/Nature Printing**

Artists will learn about the traditional form of Japanese printmaking called Gyotaku (fishermen printed from fish to record the size of their catch) and learn how to print from natural forms....no fish will be harmed in the making of our prints on rice paper and fabric. Artists will print a variety of natural forms to create prints - fish, insects, flowers, etc.

### **Dance & Music- Just Dance**

Are you interested in getting yourself moving and grooving, but not so sure where to start? This minor course is for anyone who loves to dance but has very minimal experience. We will utilize Just Dance choreography and other online resources to get our bodies used to moving together. Students will get a mind for how choreography works, learn how to build each other up while learning how to move and grow their skills through the anxiety and self-consciousness that comes with dancing publicly! Get ready to sweat!

### **Dance- Poms Dance**

This class is for dancers who want to learn & improve their pom dance skills. Students will learn basic stretching techniques to improve flexibility and learn a pom routine that enhances sharp moves, kicks, and visuals.

### **Drama- Whose Line Is It Anyway?**

What happens when actors forget their lines? They IMPROVISE, of course! Students learn how to think on their feet, be a better listener, and work with others while having fun. We will learn and practice a variety of improvisation and "warm up" activities. All are welcome!

### **Music- Beginning or Switching Orchestra**

Want to learn an instrument or switch to a new instrument next year? Students will learn the basics of how to assemble their instrument, hold their instrument, and general care of their instrument. They will also learn basic rhythm and notes to learn how to play their first tunes on their instrument. Students must provide their own instrument (strings- violin, viola, cello, bass).

### **Music- Ukulele**

Learn to play the ukulele! Students will spend one hour each day learning the introductory skills of ukulele performance. These skills include how to hold and tune the instrument, fingerpicking, and strumming chords. No ukulele? No problem! CCPS will provide one for you to use at camp.

## Senior Afternoon Minors

### **Art- Exploring Mandalas**

Students will explore the history of mandalas and how to create their own mandala. On a large scale, 24 inches, students will use puffy paints and acrylic paints to design and color their own version of a mandala.

### **Art- Mosaic Vessels**

Artists will create a colorful mosaic on a chosen vessel - glass vase or flowerpot. They will first glue glass tiles, round glass buttons, mirror tiles, shells and stones to their chosen form and then grout around them to create a cohesive vessel that can be used for display or to hold flowers or plants.

### **Drama- From Script to Stage**

Enjoy developing your basic skills and knowledge of producing drama from design to production. This class is appropriate for students with any level of drama experience and will focus on concepts such as set design, costume design, stage managing, direction, etc. All levels of artists welcome.

### **Music- Beginning or Switching Band**

Want to learn an instrument or switch to a new instrument next year? Students will learn the basics of how to assemble their instrument, hold their instrument, and general care of their instrument. They will also learn basic rhythm and notes to learn how to play their first tunes on their instrument. Students must provide their own instrument (woodwind, brass, percussion).

### **Music- Jazz Band**

Students will explore a variety of Jazz Band styles (swing, Latin, rock, blues, etc.) and learn the basics of improvisation using the blues scale. Students must provide their own instrument; students who use a school instrument during the school year ask your band teacher about using a school instrument during Summer Arts Academy.

Prerequisite: Students must have one year of successful experience on their instrument.

### **Music- STEAM Music**

What if you could make a robot play your favorite song? What if you could build a tower that plays famous classical tunes? Have you ever wanted to build your own musical instrument? Through the use of dash robots, xyloba marble towers, common household items and their own imagination, students will explore the world of STEAM by creating music through technology and engineering.
