## **Trustee election to be held May 4 at City Hall**

Of the three positions up for election to the CISD Board of Trustees two are unopposed. Two candidates have filed for Place 2. Tamara Beadles, who was appointed to fulfill a position vacated by Gabe Wittkopf earlier this year, and Christian Henry, a licensed professional counselor. Ann Reel and Doc Pierce are unopposed and will serve three-year terms.

## **BOARD ACTION...**

The Board approved:

- the installation of band bleachers and additional bleachers for the football stadium behind CHS. This year all home games will be played at the CHS stadium, beginning on September 20;
- the 24-25 certification of provision of the instructional materials process;
- the final change order for the agriculture building. The project came in \$131,000 under budget. Funds will be moved to the new CMS budget; and
- the removal of concrete and reinstallation of concrete around the sports complex at a cost of approximately \$151,000, which is included in the budget.

Other items presented:

- All board members met the annual requirement for training hours,
- Enrollment is at 1550, the highest since 2017,
- The Board set May 7 as the date for certifying the May 4 trustee election.; and
- A budget study session will be held on June 10.
