- Update of TGE 5th Grade Building by Mr. Armando Martinez, Owner, M-5 Texas Enterprise, LLC and Mr. Daniel Gonzalez, Project Superintendent.

Mr. Armando Martinez stated hello good evening Ms. Chaves, Board Members, and members of the community. Were about 88 percent complete. Tomorrow were going to pour the rest of the sidewalks and ramps and we do have an estimated completion within the next week. On Friday you will be seeing the sod going in our grass and everything. It's getting very cleaned up there up in front so things are moving along really well.

Mr. Daniel Gonzalez stated this weekend we did the reroute for the primary. The boys and girls bathrooms, the tiles are being completed 100 percent. Tomorrow we will be putting in the dividers, were going to continue cleaning up outside. This week were going to finish the ceiling system the grid and next week were going to be tile. And were pretty much at 100 percent.

Ms. Belinda Lugo stated on the issue of the name, are we going to fix that.

Mr. Gonzalez stated I have not been updated on the information right now.

Mr. Martinez stated we just go as the plan, whatever we have for plan but we are going to meet with Mr. Lazaro so he can give us the update on the next step.

Mr. Gonzalez stated the only concern that I have is that if we're going to remove the Elementary letters from the, remember were going to have holes in the brick so that's something we need to look at. Maybe just keeping the elementary and adding whatever the board decided if not, we have to replace the brick on the top part. So the quickest the biggest solution would be just to add the name that board decides.

Ms. Belinda Lugo stated that we are Tony Gonzalez Elementary so we would have to match that.

Mr. Miguel Zavala asked that the last time you were here you had said the 8th right Mr. Martinez.

Mr. Martinez stated yes and we did say the 8th but in meeting with Ms. Chavez, we have a tentative of the 20th of April as a walk through for you all so that is the date that we set with Ms. Chavez at our last meeting.

Mr. Martinez stated and just to let you all know and everybody in here that it's in the contract the best interest to finish as well because we do have our bonding tied up so there's other projects that we could use our bonding on or that we have to bid out so every time that we are bidding up a project we are losing out money so it is in our best interest to finish. We are trying to get done as quick as possible. As long as we have the information we need from our engineer, were moving right along and were working to get done.

3. Architect report of TGE 5th Grade Building by Mr. George Lazaro, Fulcrum Consulting Services.

Mr. Lazaro stated I just want to concur that we are in agreement with the percentage that M-5 indicated that 87 or 88 percent. During the last couple of weeks, we have seen a lot of dedicated effort from the contractor. We've also dedicated our forces to ensure that any questions that they have would be answered properly. We have our Junior Architects that they have been assigned basically 100 percent of the time until this project gets done and they are here in the morning and in the evening and in between if their needed. They provide the supplemental information. A lot of work has been completed in that building since the last walk through you all had and we will continue working with the contractor and be ready and will provide a tentative punch list subject to you all's approval. But hopefully we can get all that done by the 20th. So we will continue working just as we have done in the past trying to make this project a reality and have it turned over to you all officially. That's my report for tonight.

Ms. Chavez stated the documents you have before you include the Architect report based on the progress as this project noting an 87 percent purpose. The payment request is included in your documents. We had already implemented half of that payment as per your last board meeting. The summary that you have there still includes the retainage and also a balance of this project of \$71,046.00 after you implement that payment of \$113,175.80.

Ms. Oralia "Lala" Ortiz stated the \$113 thousand, is that the final payment.

 Discussion and possible action to approve the Contract Modification for 45 day Completion with Rio Roofing, INC. on the Santa Maria High School Reroofing Project.

Ms. Chavez stated we have worked very closely our Architect and with the Attorney to be able to review the modification of the contract. We have a representative here to be able to address any of your questions as per the reroofing contract that you awarded. The modification of the contract is a 45 day specification to be able to reroof the High School and the contractor is asking for an additional thirty days and I think Mr. Gonzalez can elaborate as to what those additional days may require.

Mr. Gonzalez stated those thirty additional days are for the paper work to get a warranty to get windstorm insurance so you can get your windstorm certificate. It usually takes a little longer to get them.

Ms. Chavez stated Mr. Gonzales can you elaborate on the start date.

Mr. Gonzalez stated it says in the contract that we've already gotten the bonds so the bonds are here and I think you got the insurance so were ready to start as soon as the contract is signed.

Ms. Chavez stated the Board awarded the bid at the previous meeting and this evening the only thing that is on the agenda is the approval of that modification of that contract.

Mr. De Los Santos stated madam President, members of the board; it is a pleasure to be before you, thank you very much for the opportunity. Members of the community, I'm going to be presenting. Our role as your financial advisors is to present some numbers. I hope the Superintendent developed a little presentation that takes us into that step by step so what I'd like to do is. The school board back in January made a decision to hold a Bonds Election. An Elections Bond means that when we go vote and we vote for, you are giving the School Board Members permission to make a loan to construct a building using those bonds but if you vote against, you are voting taking away the School Boards authority to make a loan to build with bonds. One big responsibility of the School Board is to always be on top of everything that is going on with the students as well as buildings of which the students are being educated in. With that objective, the School Board Members formed a Committee where they have participated along with the Superintendent, other Administrators and teachers, as well as the Architects, have studied the need for these buildings for several years to determine which the most important needs are. The committee concluded that the most important need right now is the construction of the new High School to replace our current High School. We have some pictures of the current High School which shows that it needs work and we also have some renderings of the new High School and if the bonds are approved and pass for the loan, then this would be how the new High School would look. The current High School was built in 1992. It is about 24 years old and renovations for the high school was discussed but it was determined that it would be expensive due to it being old and fragile. When this was being discussed, I was not present but I know the architects, Superintendent, and the Board Members were all present and were looking for options to finance a new school and the Federal Government was willing to lend the school \$8,375,000. This loan will cost the home owners or property owners 100 percent that has to be paid back. There is another option which has to do with the bond. It would cost almost 10 million dollars which is more than what the Federal Government is willing to lend us. The interesting part of this is that through a state program and if it passes, then the state will pay 80 percent and the District will only pay 20 percent. This state assistance that this district has used in the past is called instructional facilities allotment. This helps low income districts that pass election bonds and this program hadn't been approved by the state in about 6-8 years. Now it will be available for the district on September 1, 2016 and that is the reason that the School Board decided to bring up to the community and vote for or against this depending on you as voters. A person who has a house worth \$30,000 paid \$195 in taxes toward the District. This year it was lower, only \$65 was paid to the School District this year. It this bond passes then for the next two years, 2017-2018, the taxes would go up from \$65 to \$83 per year and from 2018 and on it would go back down to \$71 more or less. The difference in the amount from 2018 and on to how it was last year, it would be a savings of \$123. For a new High School, the majority of home owners would be paying less taxes from 2018 and on than what they already paid from 2014-2015. If you are older than 65 years of age you are registered there is an exception. As long as the value of your home does not increase including adding rooms or expanding it, then the taxes will not increase, they will stay the same. This can only be done if the election passes. It is up to you as voters to decide if the election passes or doesn't pass. And that is your right as voters. Early voting begins April 25th till the 3rd of May which will be held at the Santa Maria ISD Board Room. The last day for voting via mail will be Saturday May 7th which is also the last day to vote. Thank you very much for your attention and I will be available in case you have any questions.

Ms. Chavez stated Mr. Lazaro could you expand on the planning coming up to the High School.

Mr. Lazaro stated good evening. Mr. de Los Santos did a good job in explaining to you about the financing of the school. We have been working with the school board and with different construction committees over the past three years in bringing the district a design that will benefit the students with a new High School. Before the plans were made, we had a study done on all the campuses in the district on the needs and those studies indicated that the student population has grown and at the same time, the schools conditions have decreased and so there is a need for the construction of the new High School. In the initial plans when we started this project. When we we're working with the School Board and the construction committee, we did not have many options of being secured financially for a High School like the one that is being proposed. The only option we had, like Mr. De Los Santos stated, it was not a State level but at a Federal level instead. Now with the State initiative, we now have new options for the District. So by working with the District and the School Board, the decision was to evaluate if Santa Maria would qualify for that type of help. And it was determined could possibly help Santa Maria if the voters would permit that. It is a good program because now instead asking for 100 percent for the cost of the High School, the State will pay 80 percent of the cost and the community will only pay 20 percent. By planning ahead with the financing that comes from the State, it gives the district more opportunities. One of the things that has been discussed with the School Board and with fulcrum Consulting Services is the opportunity to make a new High School and a new football field. This is a project that is well planned.

Ms. Chavez stated can you address the new cafeteria and wat it means to that flow of student traffic.

Mr. Lazaro stated at this time all the students have to come to one place to have their breakfast and lunch so with this new High School, it will have its separate facility so that the smaller students will be apart from the older students. They will have a broad space that is designed to fit the States regulations. So this will be a more modern school and it will follow all the recommendations needed to in a new High School.
