## **NURSE'S CORNER**

Is Your Child Too Sick for School?

Early in the morning it is often difficult to make a decision about whether or not your child is sick enough to stay home from school. With minor symptoms, you often cannot tell whether your child is going to get better or worse during the course of the day. Here are some tips to help:

**The main reasons for keeping your child home are:**

- Your child's too sick to be comfortable at school.
- Your child might spread a contagious disease to others.

**As a rule of thumb a child should stay home if they have:**

- A fever (100.4 or greater) in past 24 hours
- Vomited in past 24 hours
- Diarrhea
- A very frequent cough
- Persistent pain
- A widespread rash

These problems may need to be discussed with your child's pediatrician to determine if an office visit is needed.


**When can my child return to school after illness?**

- Fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication
- Vomit and diarrhea free for 24 hours


