We celebrated Thanksgiving last week but let's continue to on what we are thankful for and count our many blessings. As we all know, gratitude is a powerful force that can bring about positivity, resilience, and a sense of well-being into our lives. Why not bring that practice into our classrooms to create a culture of thankfulness. Here are a few ideas:

Gratitude Journal: Begin or end each day with a few moments for your students (and you) to write down what they are thankful for. This simple act can set a positive tone for the day.

Gratitude Wall: Choose a designated area in the classroom for an "Appreciation Wall" where students (and you) can post notes of appreciation for each other. It is a great way to foster a sense of togetherness and recognition.

Gratitude Art and Writing: Incorporate gratitude into your writing assignments. Encourage students to write cards, thank-you notes, or poems (and illustrate them) to people for whom they are especially grateful and who mean a lot to them.

Gratitude Challenges: Set weekly gratitude challenges. For example, challenge your students to express their gratitude for someone they appreciate outside of the classroom and then report back on their experiences.

Incorporating gratitude into your classroom can lead to a happier, more positive learning environment, improved relationships, and even enhanced academic performance. So, why not choose one or two and give it a try!

Vacillate means to waver back and forth, unable to decide. You might *vacillate* between ordering waffles and pancakes at your favorite diner — it's hard to pick just one when both are so tasty! Something that *vacillates* sways or fluctuates, often quite unsteadily. So use this verb to describe the staggering motions of a person who has had too much to drink, as well as the opinions of someone who can't make up her mind. Synonyms include *vibrate*, *hesitate*, and *waver*. A wise Ethiopian proverb advises, "Do not vacillate or you will be left in between doing something, having something, and being nothing."

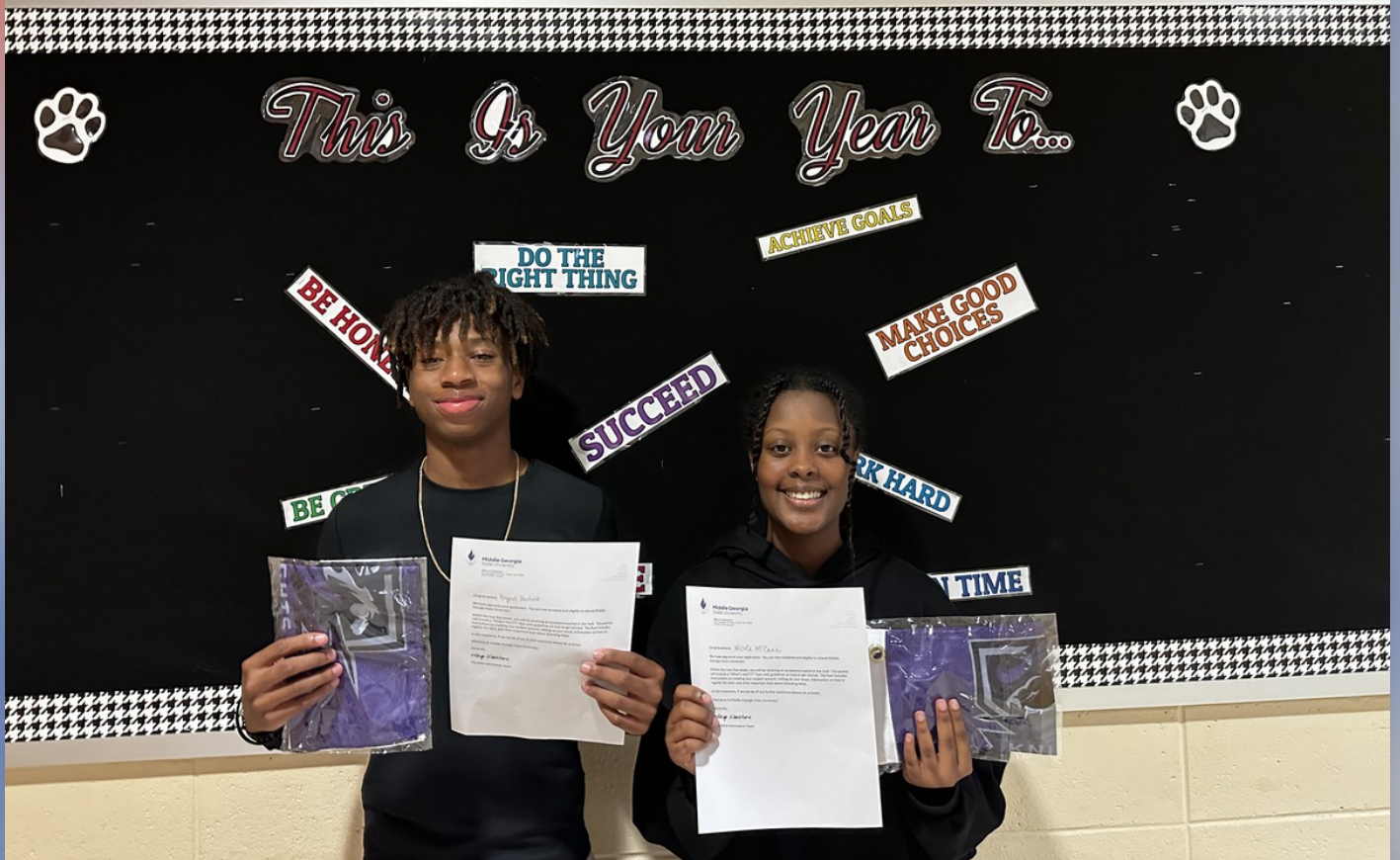

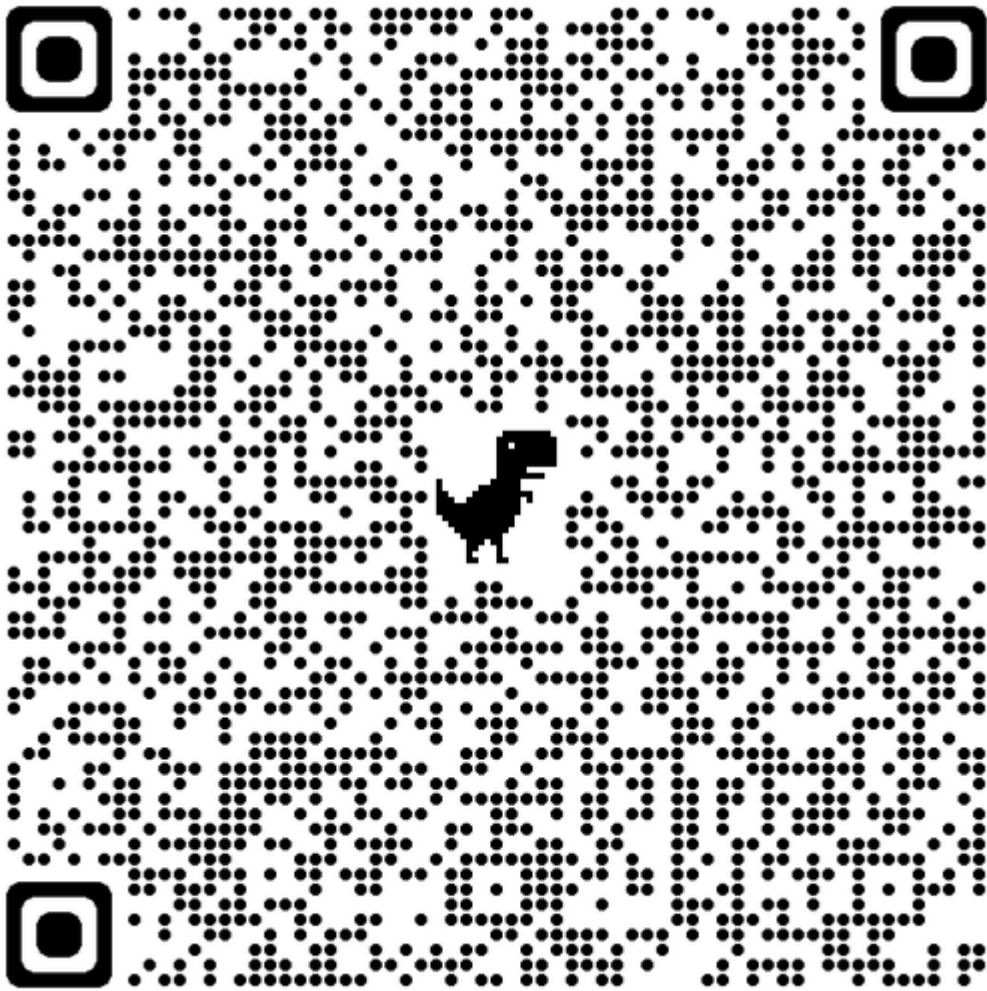
