





Suicide claims a life every 11 minutes (125 daily) in the U.S. It's the second leading cause of death for people ages 10-34.

Suicidal thoughts, much like mental health conditions, can affect anyone regardless of age, gender or background. In fact, suicide is often the result of an untreated mental health condition. Suicidal thoughts, although common, should not be considered normal and often indicate more serious issues.

September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month —a time to raise awareness of this stigmatized, and often taboo, topic. We use this month to shift public perception, spread hope and share vital information to people affected by suicide. Our goal is to ensure that

individuals, friends, and families have access to the resources they need to discuss suicide prevention and to seek help.

If you or someone you know is struggling or in crisis, help is available. Call or text 988 or chat <u>988lifeline.org</u> to reach the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline.

Warning signs include:

- Feeling extreme depression, guilt, or shame.
- Feeling hopeless.
- · Talking about, or preoccupation with, death or suicide.
- Preparing for death, such as updating/preparing a will, giving away possessions, or taking steps to access lethal means (buying a firearm, acquiring quantities of pills/medication, researching ways to die).
- Exhibiting a dramatic change in behavior, including withdrawal from friends or usual activities, increased alcohol/drug use, difficulties in sleeping or eating, decreased selfcare.

If you believe someone needs help, we encourage you to follow the ACE (Ask, Care, Escort) suicide prevention model, with these easy-to-remember steps:

Ask – Ask, "Are you thinking of killing yourself?" Although it may feel awkward, research shows that people having thoughts of suicide feel relief when someone asks them in a caring way.

Care – Show you care. The context of caring makes it a lot easier to ask the hard questions about suicide. By actively listening and engaging, without judgment, you are showing that you care – this might just be enough to help the person feel relief and that they are not alone.

Escort – When someone acknowledges that they are feeling suicidal or hopeless, care enough to connect them to the nearest helping resource. Do not leave them alone! If possible, separate them from methods of harm.



Macon-Bibb County Emergency Management Agency will feature student artwork in the 2024 Emergency Preparedness Calendar. EMA invites all students, kindergarten through 12th grade who attend a Macon-Bibb County School to submit artwork for the Contest.

SUBJECT OF ARTWORK:

Family emergency preparedness actions, severe weather conditions, and man-made disasters. Artwork could also contain a safety message about the specific hazard featured. **Examples of a family emergency preparedness action** are the creation of a home or vehicle emergency kit or practicing a disaster plan, such as an evacuation or communication plan.

Severe weather hazards include tornado, hail, flash flooding, lightning, excessive heat or cold and dangerous icy conditions.

Examples of man-made disasters are terrorism, wildfires, train derailment, chemical spills, building fires and epidemic.



Artwork guidelines

- Artwork must consist of paint, pen/pencil, pastel, crayons, or any combination of listed materials. No glitter please.
- Artwork should be created and submitted on drawing or construction paper that is 8.5" x 11.
- DEADLINE November 1, 2023. Attach this completed form below to the back of the artwork and submit to Ben Bridges or by mail.



Evaluation Criteria

Artwork will be evaluated on creative visual quality and safety message content. Selected artwork will compete in an evaluation for the 12 monthly calendar positions and the calendar cover. There will also be a collage of honorable mention entries on the back cover.






