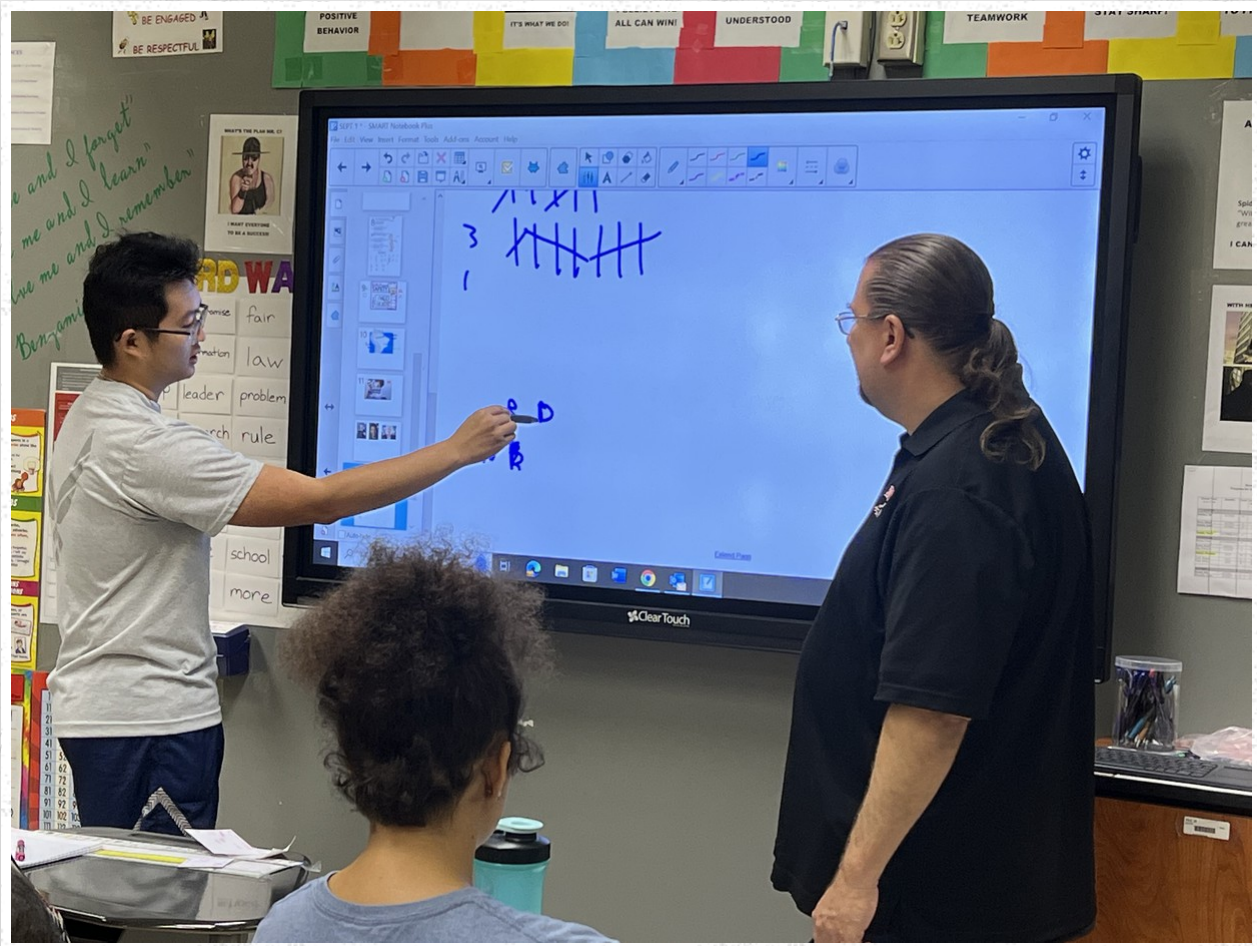

M. ZHANG (CLASS OF 2024) SUPPORTS ACCESS STUDENTS IN MATH

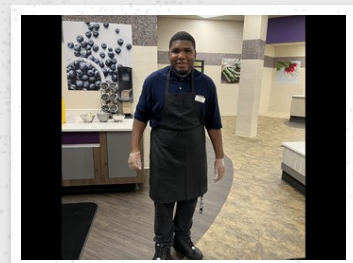
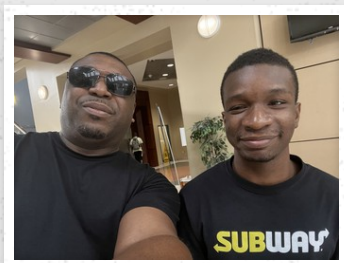

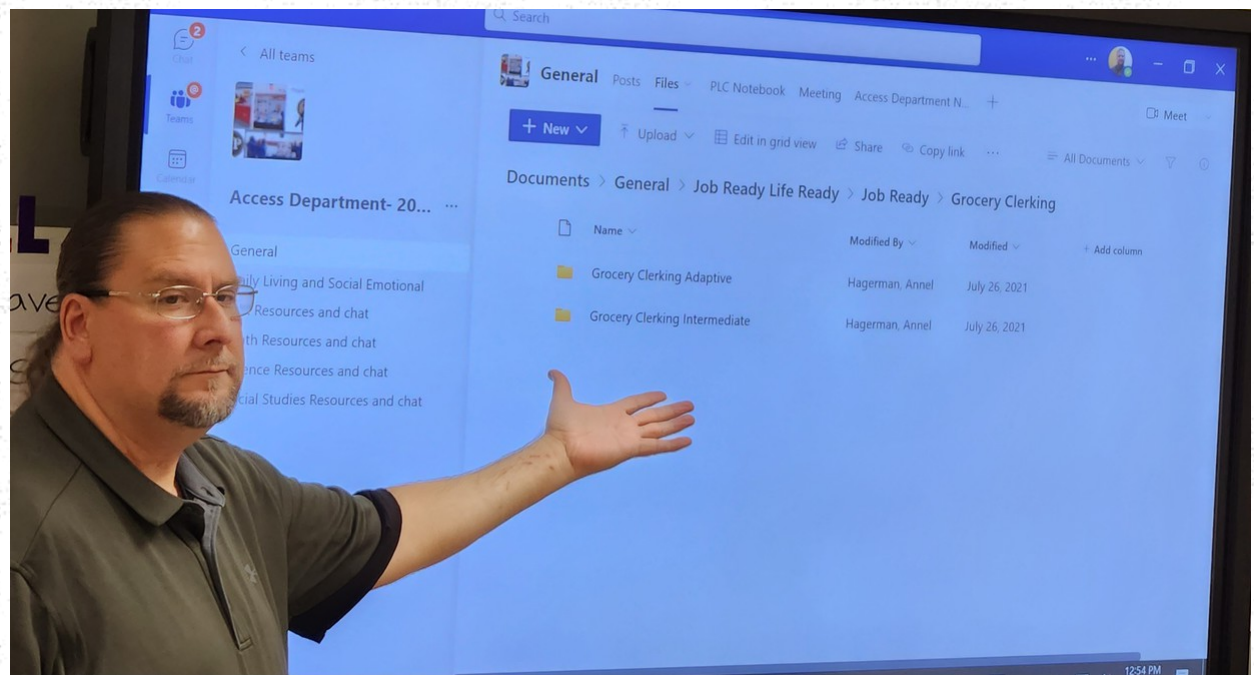

Important Information From the School Nurse

Hello Howard students and families! I am Mary Brock, RN, Howard High's School Nurse. It is my sincere hope that this note finds you doing well!

Please know that the Department of Public Health (DPH) requires students enrolled in public schools or childcare facilities to have certain immunizations or a notarized affidavit of religious exemptions in order to attend these facilities. This is especially important for our eleventh graders as there are immunizations required prior to entering the 11th grade that can potentially effect attendance eligibility.

Effective July 1, 2021, children 16 years of age and older, who are entering the 11th grade (including new entrants), must have received one booster dose of the meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4), unless their initial dose was administered on or after their 16th birthday. Meningococcal disease is a serious bacterial illness that affects the brain and the spinal cord. Meningitis can cause shock, coma and death within hours of the first symptoms. If your teen has not been vaccinated against meningococcal disease, we strongly recommend getting your 11th grader, aged 16 years or older, vaccinated as soon as possible. Getting MCV4 (meningococcal conjugate vaccine) now will not only help protect your child against the ongoing threat of meningitis, it will also meet the new school entry requirement.

Emergency Preparedness Calendar Competition

Macon-Bibb County Emergency Management Agency will feature student artwork in the 2024 Emergency Preparedness Calendar. EMA invites all students, kindergarten through 12th grade who attend a Macon-Bibb County School to submit artwork for the Contest.

SUBJECT OF ARTWORK:

Family emergency preparedness actions, severe weather conditions, and man-made disasters. Artwork could also contain a safety message about the specific hazard featured.

Examples of a family emergency preparedness action are the creation of a home or vehicle emergency kit or practicing a disaster plan, such as an evacuation or communication plan.

Severe weather hazards include tornado, hail, flash flooding, lightning, excessive heat or cold and dangerous icy conditions.

Examples of man-made disasters are terrorism, wildfires, train derailment, chemical spills, building fires and epidemic.



Artwork guidelines

- Artwork must consist of paint, pen/pencil, pastel, crayons, or any combination of listed materials. No glitter please.
- Artwork should be created and submitted on drawing or construction paper that is 8.5" x 11.

Evaluation Criteria

Artwork will be evaluated on creative visual quality and safety message content. Selected artwork will compete in an evaluation for the 12 monthly calendar positions and the calendar cover. There will also be a collage of honorable mention entries on the back cover.

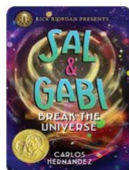

Applications for the 2024 Aim High Flight Academy (AHFA) are now open! The application window will be open from **1 Sept- 15 Oct**. The Aim High Flight Academy (AHFA) is an aviation scholarship for a three-week introductory flight program at various universities across the country. After completion of the AHFA, students will understand the pathways to becoming an Air Force aviator, and will have earned up to 15 flight hours. Below are some frequently asked questions. If you have additional questions, please visit our website for more info.

- **Who can apply?** Any high school student that will be 16 years old by June 1, 2024 is eligible to apply.
- **Where is it located?** We have various training locations across the U.S. Once selected, students will list their preferences and be matched to a university.
