Hello Howard students and families! I am Mary Brock, RN, Howard High's School Nurse. It is my sincere hope that this note finds you doing well!

Please know that the Department of Public Health (DPH) requires students enrolled in public schools or childcare facilities to have certain immunizations or a notarized affidavit of religious exemptions in order to attend these facilities. This is especially important for our eleventh graders as there are immunizations required prior to entering the 11th grade that can potentially effect attendance eligibility.

Effective July 1, 2021, children 16 years of age and older, who are entering the 11th grade (including new entrants), must have received one booster dose of the meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4), unless their initial dose was administered on or after their 16th birthday. Meningococcal disease is a serious bacterial illness that affects the brain and the spinal cord. Meningitis can cause shock, coma and death within hours of the first symptoms. If your teen has not been vaccinated against meningococcal disease, we strongly recommend getting your 11th grader, aged 16 years or older, vaccinated as soon as possible. Getting MCV4

(meningococcal conjugate vaccine) now will not only help protect your child against the ongoing threat of meningitis, it will also meet the new school entry requirement. 

SELF-CARE CORNER

As we continue to Breathe for Beginnings this new school year, I hope you are settling into a routine with your students and your classes. Did you know that with typical breaths, we are

take into our body, we can increase our brain function! Often, we are forcing our brain to work in overdrive when we are not feeding it enough oxygen. When we feed our brain the oxygen it needs to function properly, we can increase our capacity to think, we can decrease stress, and we can regulate our emotions. Share this information with your class and then consider leading your students with 3 collective breaths at the beginning of class!! (example below)

- 1. I invite you to get comfortable in your seat.
- 2. You can soften your gaze and look down at the floor or close your eyes, whichever is more comfortable for you.

- 4. Take a deep breath in through your nose and exhale through your mouth.
- 5. Take another deep breath in and exhale.
- 6. Take a final deep breath, biggest breath of the day, and exhale with an audible sigh.
- 7. If your eyes are closed, you can open them.
- 8. Now, don't ya'll feel smarter and better already????
- 9. Let's get started with our lesson for today.

GUIDE TO CHATGPT FOR PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS BY COMMONSENSE.ORG

What is ChatGPT?

ChatGPT is a computer program that uses artificial intelligence (AI) to generate text. Launched by research company OpenAI, it gathers large amounts of data from the internet to create responses on demand. ChatGPT is unique because its answers are in conversational format, similar to how people write and speak. It can write essays and computer code, solve math problems, and much more.

How do you use ChatGPT?

To use ChatGPT, you first create a free account <u>on the OpenAI website</u>. Then you simply type questions or commands in the text box. Your requests can be as basic or elaborate as you can imagine. For example, you could ask it to write a story in the voice of your favorite movie character. Or ask it to give you a recipe based on the food you have at home. The tool allows you to continue to refine the answer by adding more instructions. ChatGPT saves a record of your conversations that you can view or continue at a later time.

Where does ChatGPT get its information?

To craft its responses, ChatGPT copies and remixes information from other places on the internet. It doesn't tell you its sources or who created the original information. As of this article's publication date, it uses internet data created up to 2021 only. The tool is still being developed, so it can make mistakes, spread misinformation, and give inaccurate answers.

Why are schools banning ChatGPT?

Many school districts <u>are blocking ChatGPT</u> on campus networks and school-issued devices. The concern is that students could use it to do their schoolwork for them, from writing papers to solving equations. They could also be turning in work with inaccurate information. Educators are worried the program could affect students' learning if they rely on it. Check with your children's school to see if and how they allow students to use ChatGPT. Please review the Student Code of Conduct Book on page 13 for violations.

Level III

Level III violations include those infractions which are more severe in nature than in Level II and interfere with the orderly operation of the classroom, the bus and/or the school. These acts include, but are not limited to: repeated, but unrelated acts of minor misconduct and misbehaviors directed against persons or property and may impede the learning or jeopardize the health, safety or well-being of others. Consideration of necessary interventions and Positive Behavior Supports will be given through the RTI process, if not already provided.

Based on the severity or context of the misconduct, certain Level III violations may be elevated to Level IV violations or higher.

Level III violations include such behaviors, but are not limited to:

- · Any pattern of/or repeated violations cited in previous level
- Repeated (more than 3) cutting of class or other scheduled activities
- Truancy (more than 5)
- · Failure to accept disciplinary action
- · Violation of District medication policy
- Unwanted touching of others
- Bullying, Cyber-bullying, Harassing, or Intimidation, as defined by the code of conduct and in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 20-2-751.4
- Selling or soliciting for sale any merchandise on the school campus, without the authorization of the building principal or school official
- Throwing objects which cause bodily injury or damage to property
- Physical attack without injury/fighting or physical violence towards another student that causes no injury or only a minor injury- Simple battery
- · Verbal intent to cause harm or threat- Simple assault
- Being disrespectful toward school personnel or school visitors
- Using profane, obscene, indecent remarks or racially or ethnically offensive language and/or gestures directed toward others
- Destruction of school property
- Making false accusations, reports or allegations
- Fourth or subsequent violation of District dress code policy (follow consequences as outlined in Code of Conduct pg. 20-21)
- Misuse of District technology, including but not limited to the Internet, the District Network, or District-owned equipment or software, as described below:
 - Deliberate search or keying of a URL, domain name or website in attempts to access inappropriate material
 - o Attempt to login as anyone other than yourself
 - o Providing electronically, personal information about yourself, your family or others
 - o Misrepresentation (forgery) of information
 - Plagiarism. Students are responsible for their own work. This means the use of an artificial intelligence (AI) tool to generate a response to an assignment and claim it as their own is considered plagiarism.
 - o Misuse of computers for non-school related activities, including gambling, shopping,

AIM HIGH FLIGHT ACADEMY APPLICATION OPEN!

Applications for the 2024 Aim High Flight Academy (AHFA) are now open! The application window will be open from 1 Sept- 15 Oct. The Aim High Flight Academy (AHFA) is an aviation scholarship for a three-week introductory flight program at various universities across the country. After completion of the AHFA, students will understand the pathways to becoming an Air Force aviator, and will have earned up to 15 flight hours. Below are some frequently asked questions. If you have additional questions, please visit our website for more info.


- Who can apply? Any high school student that will be 16 years old by June 1, 2024 is eligible to apply.
- Where is it located? We have various training locations across the U.S. Once selected, students will list their preferences and be matched to a university.
- Who pays for the program? The U.S. Air Force funds everything including travel to and from training. Selected students will incur no costs associated with the flight academy.
- **Do I need to know how to fly?** NO! This is an introductory program designed to take students from no flight knowledge to 12-15 flight hours.
- Where do I apply? Follow the link here. You'll need to answer some questions about yourself, have a nominator (like a job reference) recommend you, complete a short essay, and complete a creative graphic.
- Do I need to join the Air Force if I get accepted? NO! Our program incurs no military service commitment and is designed for unaffiliated youth to explore aviation.
