





BCSD Laptop Return

All Students in grades 9-11 will need to return school issued laptops, chargers, and carrying cases to the media center by Wednesday, May 25, 2022. Students will not be allowed to keep laptops over the summer. If there is damage to the device, a form with the cost to repair or

replace will be signed and sent home to parents. Fines will be placed in Infinite Campus for any unpaid damages. Laptops must be returned even if you plan to attend summer school. A new laptop contract must be signed after proof of summer school registration.

Progress Reports

The final progress report for second semester will be posted to the parent and student portals on Tuesday, April 19th. Students - please make sure that you are communicating with your teachers to find out what you need to do to bring up any failing grades by the end of the semester on May 25th. Remember that promotion to the next grade level is contingent upon you earning the requisite number of credits by the end of the year. Credits are earned for courses passed with a 70 or higher. Please also remember to check your attendance - if you have more than 6 unexcused absences in a class that you are passing at the end of the semester, the grade will be converted to a failing grade of 69 and you will NOT earn credit for the course. Make plans now to attend Attendance Recovery so that this does not happen to you!

ATTENDANCE RECOVERY (Attend through May 19)

- · Students with more than 5 unexcused absences in a class will receive a grade of 69, if you are passing the course.
- · These absences are counted PER CLASS PERIOD.
- · If you have been absent more than 5 days in ANY class period, you will need to attend Attendance Recovery in order to keep your grade in the course.
- · Every time you attend Attendance Recovery awards you are awarded two class periods of "Made Up Time".
- · If this time is not made up by the end of the semester grading period, students will receive a grade of 69 in their course work.
- · Attendance Recovery is held Monday- Thursday from 2:45 to 4:15 in room 124. You must sign in and stay the entire time to receive credit. 32 student max capacity. No more than this are allowed to stay.
- · You must bring work with you or work on the computer. You are not allowed to be on your phone or sleep during attendance recovery.
- · If you are unsure about your attendance, please login to your student portal to see your absence report.

SUMMER SCHOOL 2022 - Register on June 2

Summer School for Howard High School students will start Monday, June 6 and run through Thursday, June 30.

Students are required to attend summer school IN PERSON - there is no virtual option. Registration for summer school will be held one day on June 2, 2022. Students who would like to use a school issued laptop will need to have parents sign a summer school contract to check out a laptop for usage during summer school. Stop by the media center after you register.

Please continue to check your email regarding information about summer school - this will be sent out to parents and students at the end of the semester sometime between May 25-27 as grades are finalized and posted.

Further information will be shared as the details regarding summer school are finalized; however, if a student failed one or more academic classes first semester, he/she needs to make plans to attend summer school. Not attending summer school to recover credits that weren't earned during fall (or spring) semester most likely means that the student will NOT promote to the next grade level.

COVID-19 Testing at Schools for Staff and Students






Media Center Checkouts


PLAYCARD (Pines Library Access for Youth - Student Library Card Program)

 - EXAMPLE: Your birthday is August 1, 2005. Type 082005 to check out books and other resources at any MGRL branch.



May is National Bicycle Safety Month

MACON, Ga. (May 3, 2022) May is National Bicycle Safety Month, which reminds Georgians to examine their habits as drivers and riders in order to safely share the road. Unfortunately, injuries and deaths from bicycle crashes continue to be a serious problem in many states. According to the National Safety Council, the number of preventable deaths from bicycle transportation incidents increased 16% in 2020 and have increased 44% in the last 10 years, from 873 in 2011 to 1,260 in 2020.

"After 2 years in a global pandemic, outdoor activities are on the rise," said Montrae Waiters, spokeswoman, AAA – The Auto Club Group. "School-aged children are spending more time riding their bicycles, and Georgia law states children 16 years and under must wear a helmet. Unfortunately, not everyone does. So AAA Macon is partnering with the local community to ensure children can get a helmet if they do not have one."

To promote bicycle safety, AAA – The Auto Club Group is sponsoring the Mercer Bike & Roll, and will be donating 500 bicycle helmets to children in need.


