

# **COUNSELORS CORNER**

### **ATTENDANCE RECOVERY**

Have you been ABSENT?

 $\cdot$  Students with more than 5 unexcused absences in a class will receive a grade of 69, if you are passing the course.

· These absences are counted PER CLASS PERIOD.

• If you have been absent more than 5 days in ANY class period, you will need to attend Attendance Recovery in order to keep your grade in the course.

• Every time you attend Attendance Recovery awards you are awarded two class periods of "Made Up Time".

• If this time is not made up by the end of the semester grading period, students will receive a grade of 69 in their course work.

• Attendance Recovery is held Monday- Thursday from 2:45 to 4:15 in room 124. You must sign in and stay the entire time to receive credit. 32 student max capacity. No more than this are allowed to stay.

• You must bring work with you or work on the computer. You are not allowed to be on your phone or sleep during attendance recovery.





# **Reading Strategy - Carousel Brainstorming**

**Carousel Brainstorming, also known as Rotating Review**, provides scaffolding for new information to be learned or existing information to be reviewed through movement, conversation, and reflection. This strategy is a cooperative learning activity that can be used to discover and discuss background knowledge prior to studying a new topic and to review content already learned. It allows for small group discussion followed by whole-class reflection (<u>www.readwritethink.org</u>).

Procedure:

• Choose several topics/concepts that are new or being reviewed from a lesson previously taught. Write topic/concept/question on chart paper and tape paper to wall around room. Each chart paper is considered a "station."

• Divide class into small groups of three or four. Give each groups a different color marker. Assign each group to a particular station.

Give groups 1-2 minutes to discuss topic/concept/question written on the chart paper.
 Groups write on paper everything they know or have learned about the topic on the chart paper.
 After 1-2 minutes, groups should rotate to the next station. They read the

topic/concept/question as well as what others have written about it. The group discuss the topic and add **new** information. Students can write questions about what other groups wrote. • Continue this process until each group return to their original station.

• At the end of rotation brainstorming session, discuss topic/concept/question on each chart paper, read and discuss what each group wrote. Additional questions may be answered during the discussion.


