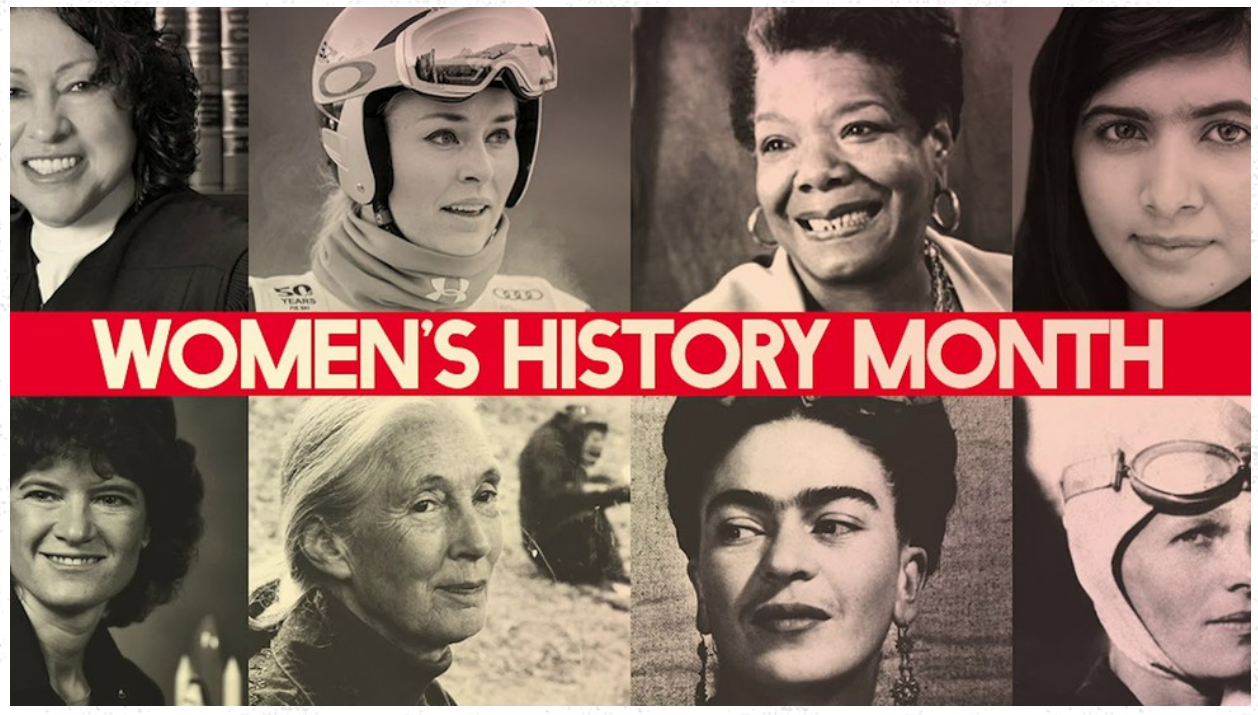

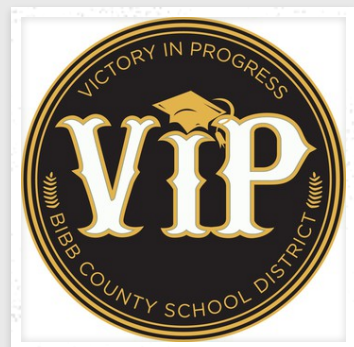

*Take regular breaks from technology and the Internet to spend time on other activities and interests.*

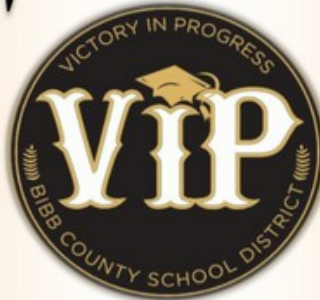

### **What Can You Do to Help?**

## PROGRESS REPORTS

Progress Report grades posted to the student and parent portals of Infinite Campus on Wednesday, March 2nd.

**Students** - please make sure that you are working to bring up failing grades. Speak with your teachers about any opportunities to make up missing assignments or quizzes/tests. Partial credit is better than no credit!

Promotion at the high school level is based entirely on credits earned by the end of the school year.

To **promote to 10th grade**, a student must have to have 5 total credits (3 of which need to be core academic - English, Math, Science, or Social Studies - credits).

To **promote to 11th grade**, a student must have to have 11 total credits (6 of which need to be core academic credits).

To **promote to 12th grade**, a student must have 17 total credits (9 of which need to be core academic credits).

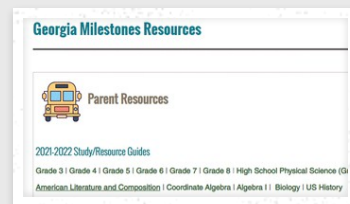
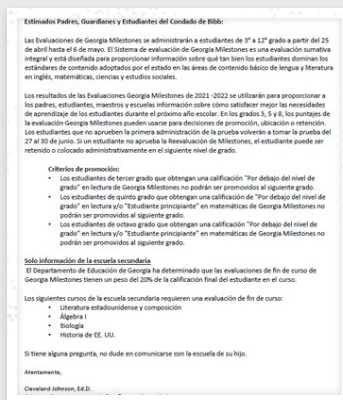
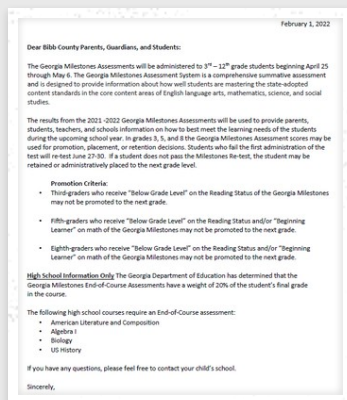
Remember that attendance also affects your grade! If you have more than 5 unexcused absences, any passing grades at the end of the semester will become a failing grade of 69. Attendance recovery is ongoing every Monday through Thursday afternoon in room 124 from 2:35-4:15 pm. Every afternoon stayed in its entirety removes 2 unexcused absence class periods from your attendance. Check your days in IC and, if you have more than 5 unexcused absences in each class, make plans to stay after school for Attendance Recovery and get caught up.

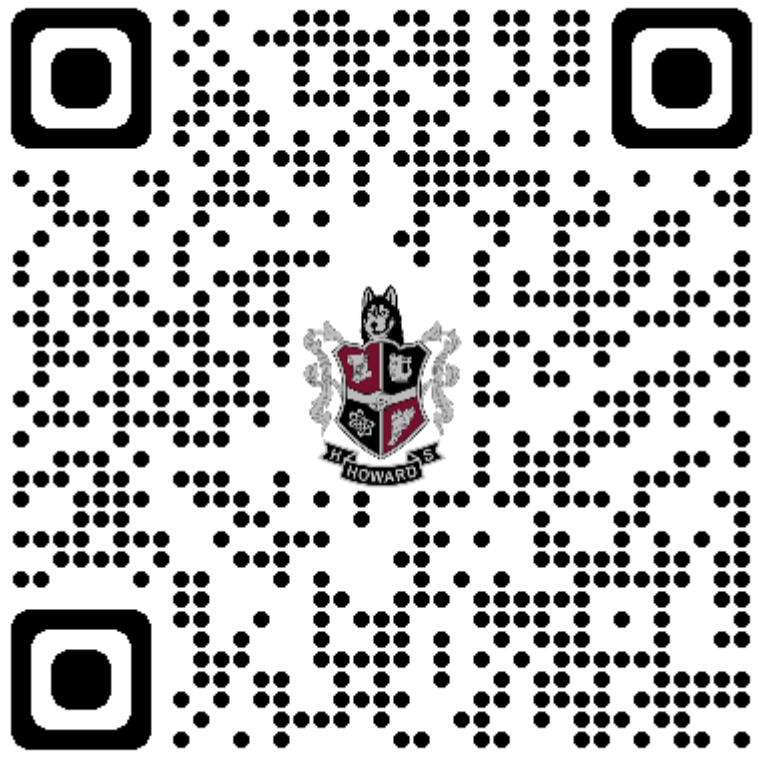

**OVERVIEW:**  
The Douglass Theatre's Historically Black College & University (HBCU) Arts Series highlights the creative and imaginative excellence of HBCU students and alumni. The HBCU Arts Series Student Scholarship was started to further fulfill the Douglass Theatre's goal of being a valuable resource for the community. The scholarship is intended to help (HBCU bound) graduating high school seniors across Central Georgia to defray college expenses.

**AWARD AMOUNT & APPLICATION PERIOD:**  
The maximum award amount is \$5,000 and based on funds available. The deadline for the application is on or before **April 1st** of each year. **Completed applications may be submitted electronically via email or mailed via U.S. mail to the address above. Applications submitted via email or postmarked after the deadline date will not be considered.**

**ELIGIBILITY:**  
The opportunity to apply is open to students who meet the eligibility criteria listed below. The HBCU Arts Series Student Scholarship is a **one-time award** and applicant **must** meet all criteria at the time of applying:

- Must be a **High School Senior** who has been officially accepted to and will be attending an accredited two or four-year Historical Black College & University (HBCU) during the fall term following graduation. The applicant must be able to provide proof of a copy of acceptance letter to an accredited HBCU.
- Must have a minimum 2.7 GPA
- Applicants are encouraged to provide a web link or submit a photo collage or a short video of a creative performance/project that he/she has participated in (visual arts/photography, chorus/band, dancing, singing, etc).

**APPLICATION PROCESS:**  
Complete and submit application form (via email or U.S. mail listed above):

- Include two (2) reference letters from teachers/professors/counselors/employers
- Include high school transcript (unofficial acceptable) or letter (certified by graduation coach/counselor)
- Include copy of acceptance letter to an accredited HBCU
- Include a one-page essay (250-300 words) on one (1) of the following topics:
  - o How do you see art by African Americans impacting society?
  - o Historically, African American Artists have impacted social justice movements, such as the Progressive Era, the Civil Rights Movement and Black Power Movement. How do you think Art by African Americans impacts social justice movements today? Choose a current artist and describe their impact.
  - o Have you recently attended any events at the Douglass or another theater? Describe the event and how it influenced your artistic expression.
  - o Write an artist statement. Share how the Douglass Theater HBCU Arts Series Scholarship will contribute to your development. (This question is inspired by the others).
  - o The Harlem Renaissance was an era in which African American Artists flourished. Choose an artist of any discipline from the era and describe how their work influences your own.

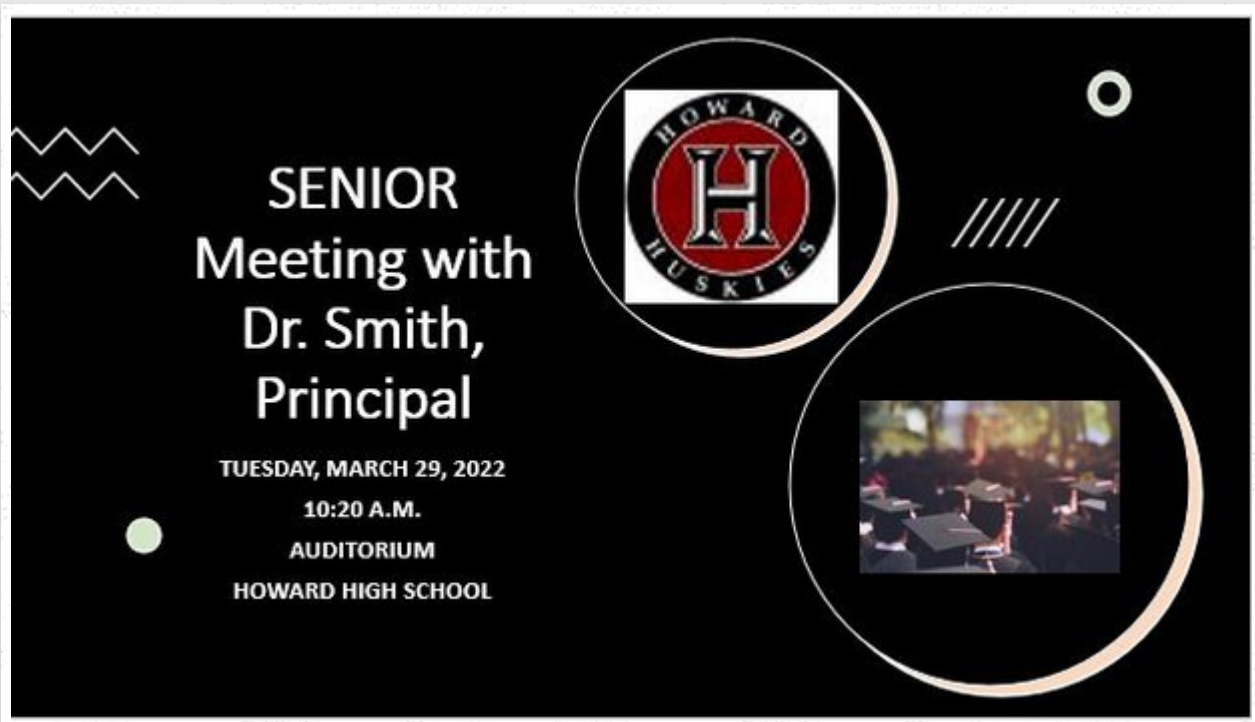

## **LITERACY CORNER**

### **READING STRATEGY: SCAVENGER HUNT**

## Scavenger Hunt

Scavenger Hunt is designed to support students in reading more actively and purposefully. Teachers can target specific standards-based reading skills by creating different types of search tasks that require students to practice those specific reading skills. Once teachers have created the specific search tasks, steps will be followed to engage all students in a text-based Scavenger Hunt. (McTighe, J. and Silver, H.F. (2020) *Teaching for Deeper Learning: Tools to Engage Students in Meaning Making*).

Below is a sample of possible search tasks for standards-based reading skills:

Reading Skill	Sample Search Tasks That Build This Skill
Search for factual/explicitly stated information.	How did the alien communicate to Alicia that he was lost? Find the sentence or paragraph that tell us. Find two examples of adaptation mentioned in the article.
Use textual evidence to support inferences/conclusions.	Find two words or picture that might lead us to conclude that Bobby is scared. Find three sentences from the passage that support the following conclusion...
Identify central ideas and themes.	Find the paragraph that best reflects the main idea of this passage as a whole. If the main idea of this passage is _____, what two details from the text best support it?
Find passages that reveal the author's point of view or purpose.	Find at least three sentences that help reveal the author's point of view. Does the author believe that the United States' military escalation during Vietnam was justified or a mistake? Find evidence to support your position.

Once search tasks are determined for a text, follow the steps to engage students in a text-based Scavenger Hunt:

1. Provide students with a copy of the text and the search tasks.
2. Instruct students how to work and how to mark or record findings (mark text or post-it notes).
3. Walk around the room, look, or listen in as students work, and provide support as needed.
4. Review and discuss students' responses as a class.
5. Encourage students to defend or debate their responses, and work to build a consensus when appropriate. Sometime one response is better supported than another. Make sure students understand why.
6. Use students' responses to specific search tasks to zero in on the skills that are giving students the most trouble.
