LITERACY CORNER

BLACK HISTORY MONTH - LITTLE KNOWN FACTS

CARTER G. WOODSON

December 19, 1875 - April 3, 1950

Carter G. Woodson was an African American writer and historian known as the 'Father of Black History.' He penned the influential book 'The Mis-Education of the Negro.'

Carter G. Woodson was the second African American to receive a doctorate from Harvard, after [W.E.B. Du Bois](#). Known as the "Father of Black History," Woodson dedicated his career to the field of African American history and lobbied extensively to establish [Black History Month](#) as a nationwide institution. He also wrote many historical works, including the 1933 book *The Mis-Education of the Negro*. He died in Washington, D.C., in 1950.

Single-Sentence Summaries (STRATEGY)

Single-Sentence Summaries takes advantage of note making and summarizing to make reading more active and reflective (Silver & McTighe, 2020). This is a comprehension enhancing strategy. Students make notes as they read, and sentence summaries are frequent and short. Single-Sentence Summaries are written for every paragraph or few paragraphs. The frequency and brevity will build summarizing habit to the point where it becomes second nature for students to stop, think, and jot down the big ideas they read. (Silver & McTighe, 2020). Sentence Summaries are not a sentence copied from the text. Summaries are to be in students' own words showing what they believe is most important.

Before students use this strategy, help them understand what a successful sentence summary looks and sound like. The following practices may be used: Model the process of thinking aloud while creating a single-sentence summary, ask students to imagine what the author would say is his/her big idea of paragraph/section, challenge students to determine strong and weak sentence summaries, ask student to underline key words that should be in the summary, generate a number of sentence summaries and have students select the ones that they believe best summarizes the paragraphs.
