Classroom time is critical and we need our students to be present and on time daily!


What Can You Do to Help?

COUNSELORS CORNER

SCOIR

We want all students at Howard High School to be college or career ready upon graduation. While there are many resources out there to help us achieve this goal, our district will begin using SCOIR to help students research college and career options. SCOIR is an online resource that is free for Bibb County School District high school students - not only will it allow students to develop their own personal profile of careers and/or colleges that they are interested in, but it will also allow them to keep track of volunteer and work hours, activities, achievements, etc. to make creating a resume easy. In the next couple of weeks prior to the Thanksgiving break, students will receive an email to their school email address inviting them to create their SCOIR account. Students are highly encouraged to use their school email address and school email address password when creating their account, so that it is easy for them to remember. Once students have created their account, a great first step is to take the aptitude test linked through YouScience. The results of this aptitude test will provide each student with an in-depth profile of their talents and abilities, and it will match them with career

paths and college majors which would be a good fit for them. If you have questions, please don't hesitate to reach out to your school counselor.

ATTENDANCE RECOVERY

Students - do you have more than 5 unexcused absences in one or more of your class periods? Remember that a total of 6 or more unexcused absences in a class period results in you receiving a failing grade of 69 in that class at the end of the semester, and therefore not earning credit for the course. Attendance Recovery is currently running each week, Monday-Thursday from 2:40 pm to 4:15 pm in Room 124. For each afternoon you attend, 2 unexcused absences (2 class periods, NOT 2 full days) will be removed. You must attend in person; there is no option to complete Attendance Recovery virtually. Make sure you bring homework/study materials to work on during the time you attend. Don't wait until the last minute - unexcused absences must be recovered no later than the end of the following month (example: absences earned in October MUST be made up by the end of November).





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ESSAY WRITING FRAME

A Writing Frame sets the structure of a particular text type and may be used to scaffold


type enable learners to focus on expressing their thoughts. Although the following is a frame for writing a comparison and contrast essay, the Essay Writing Frame may be used for other text types.

For the Comparison and Contrast essay, it should contain four basic parts:

- 1. An opening sentence that introduces your findings.
- 2. Sentences that express how the two ideas, things, or people are alike. Use signal words like both, alike, similar, same, and resemble.
- 3. Sentences that express how the two ideas, things, or people are different. Use signal words like but, although, in contrast to, unlike, and while.
- 4. A concluding sentence that summarizes your belief or findings. See excerpt below for an example.
