Lafayette School Corp. Kindergarten Round-Up open March 5

The Lafayette School Corp. will open Kindergarten pre-registration for 2024-25 on March 5.

Families are encouraged to attend in-person registration 4-7 p.m. Tuesday, March 5, at their neighborhood school. Online registration will be open March 6-April 30.

Students must be 5 years old by Aug. 1, 2024, to enter Kindergarten. Parents should be prepared with student's birth certificate, as well as parent contact information (address, phone number and email address).

LSC is an open enrollment school; students do not need to live within the LSC boundaries to attend a school in the corporation. Some schools offer programs to accommodate families' various needs: Oakland Elementary operates on a balanced calendar, Edgelea Elementary offers high-ability and dual-language classes, and Glen Acres Elementary has an onsite preschool.

Multi-Language Learning

Students entering Kindergarten this fall will have the option of enrolling in the new Dual-Language Program at Edgelea Elementary School. This program, which supports learning in both native English and Spanish, focuses on language acquisition, bilingualism and biliteracy. Studies have shown that bilingual and biliterate students benefit in cognitive development, flexible and abstract thinking, and learning new concepts. LSC is pleased to offer this new program model; this fall, the Kindergarten classroom will open, and the plan is to add a grade level each year.

Lafayette School Corp. offers a variety of academic options for students. Sunnyside Intermediate School has been designated a STEM school; Jefferson High School boasts, in addition to core courses, 20 Advanced Placement courses, one of the best performing arts programs in the state, along with a 100-year-old high school newspaper, a science research class that pairs students with Purdue professors, a student-run radio station, a wide variety of visual arts classes, a student-run café in the culinary arts program, and more than 20 interscholastic athletic programs.
