TIPS FOR SAFEGUARDING DEVICES AND HELPING YOUR CHILD UNDERSTAND THE RISKS OF SOCIAL MEDIA

Kids are spending more and more time on social media and technology devices. The internet is an attractive place for predators and bullies to interact with them. It is important to be aware of what is out there to protect your child from bullying, unwanted sexual messaging, location identification and so much more. Most apps, regardless of how harmless they seem, have the potential risk of exposing your children to inappropriate behaviors. If an app allows pictures, even if those pictures are “deleted”, these can be screenshot from any phone and be used against someone.

BE AWARE

Know what dangers are out there and what technology and devices your child is using. Research apps that are currently trending and learn about the dangers of different apps. Most apps have a recommended age rating, but it is rarely enforced or verified.

MONITOR

Keep your iTunes password private. Research the app before you allow your child to download it. Have parental control apps. Keep all technology, including phone, access in high traffic areas of the house – it is unwise to leave a child alone with access to the internet.

TALK

Have regular discussions about appropriate technology use and the dangers of predators and bullying. Encourage your child to use technology for good. Educate your child on the dangers of giving out passwords, even to close friends, or any personal information through social media.
