CLASS TITLE: SKILLED MAINTENANCE WORKER - CARPENTER

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of a Maintenance Supervisor, perform journey level Carpentry work in the repair of building Carpentry systems and semi-skilled work in one or more of the skilled trades, including carpentry, electrical, plumbing, cabinet-making and HVAC.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

- 1. Perform journey-level carpentry work in the maintenance, repair, construction and alteration of District buildings and facilities; Assure compliance with building, health and safety codes and standards.
- 2. Maintain and repair woodwork in District school facilities; match materials for color, grain or texture; cut, fit, and hang doors, windows, sashes, and screens; repair floorings.
- 3. Construct, alter, repair and inspect structures including cabinets, shelves, partitions, counters, doors, window frames, scaffolds, shelving, stairways, bookcases and a variety of special fixtures.
- 4. Maintain records of time and materials.
- 5. Interpret blueprints, shop drawings, sketches and work orders.
- 6. Shop math applicable to the building trades.
- 7. Perform routine maintenance and minor repairs to HVAC equipment including fans, blowers, pumps, thermostats and motors; install and maintain clocks, switches and electrical fixtures and equipment. Replace light ballasts, retrofit light fixtures, install conduit, and install electrical circuits.
- 8. Install water pipes, tap water and sewer mains and laterals; repair and replace pipes, valves, fittings and other fixtures; clean drain and sewer obstructions.
- 9. Install, maintain and repair chain link and wooden fences.
- 10. Operate equipment like skip loaders, dump trucks, forklifts, bobcat, trenchers, and concrete grinder.
- 11. Perform other related duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES:

KNOWLEDGE OF:

- Methods, practices, equipment and tools used in various trades including carpentry, plumbing, electrical, cabinet-making and HVAC
- Chain link and wooden fences
- Health and safety regulations

ABILITY TO:

- Perform journey level carpentry work
- Provide technical assistance to outside contractors; provide contractors with specifications,
- Plans and site locations related to specific projects.
- Use hand and power tools skillfully and safely
- Work from sketches, plans and blueprints
- Perform journey-level work in one or more skilled trades
- Install and repair chain link and wooden fences
- Understand and follow oral and written directions
- Work cooperatively with others
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with others
- Analyze situations accurately and adopt an effective course of action
- Lift objects weighing up to 100 pounds

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

- High School Diploma, GED or certificate of completion.
- Three years general construction and maintenance experience.
- Completion of a recognized carpentry apprenticeship program or equivalent,
- And any combination equivalent to one year of experience as a journey-level Carpenter.

LICENSES AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

• Valid California driver's license

WORKING CONDITIONS:

Work includes indoor and outdoor environment; subject to driving from site to site; may require extended day/hour assignments; climbing, stooping, bending, reaching over head, working with arms above shoulder level, crawling, standing, walking, sitting, kneeling, squatting; exerts pressure/repetitive twisting with wrists and hands; works with hand and power tools; lifts, carries, pushes, pulls or moves up to 100 lbs.; works near mechanical parts; exposed to chemicals, fumes, strong odors, toxic materials, dust, and airborne particles; works with sharp objects; works with electrical hazards; exposed to noise levels (e.g. power tools and equipment) up to 108 dBa; works independently; works alone; works in confined places; works in high places; works with tight deadlines; works in presence of children; has direct contact with students, district staff, site administrators, general public; exposed to minor contagious diseases;

dust masks, eye and ear protection may be required. Work a flexible work week; including weekends as scheduled.
