## JOB GOALS:

- 1. Nurture the unique abilities of gifted/talented students by developing a challenging learning environment.
- 2. Develop self-awareness by providing opportunities for students to learn coping skills relative to their gifts.
- 3. Provide identification procedures based on what a district can do now or arrange to do soon.
- 4. Provide frequent opportunities for students who have been identified with academic gifts to learn with children of similar abilities.

## PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Establish lines of communication with classroom teachers, administrators and parents. (Be the "Ambassador" of the TAP program.)
- 2. Provide information to staff and parents (grades 3-5) regarding services, curriculum, and individual student performance in the gifted/talented program.
- 3. Model whole class enrichment and thinking skills lessons K-5
- 4. Keep ongoing data about K-2 students to assist in the screening and identification process of gifted/talented students.
- 5. Provide staff development activities on differentiation and identification.
- 6. Assist classroom teachers with the implementation of differentiation strategies to meet the needs of gifted/talented students.

- 7. Design and deliver instruction to small groups of students identified as gifted/talented (1 hr. language arts weekly, daily math grades 4-5, 1 hr. math weekly grade 3).
- 8. Collaborate on the educational plans and implement portions of the plans for gifted/talented students.
- 9. Collaborate on the educational plans and implementation of those plans for "highly gifted" students K-5.
- 10. Assist in collecting information for program evaluation.
- 11. Participate in team meetings and the Gifted Advisory Committee.
- 12. Report to the building principal and Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction.
