

Testing will occur during blocks 1 and 2

Who is taking the NJSLA for Mathematics?

- All Freshman
- Any student that has not taken the NJSLA Algebra 1 or Geometry, regardless of grade level

What test will you be taking?

- NJSLA Algebra 1-Any student that is currently in Algebra 1
- NJSLA Geometry-Any student that is currently in Geometry

Passing score:

- Algebra 1 is a 750 or greater
- Geometry is a 725 or greater



- Any other student that has not taken the NJSLA, regardless of grade level

State Testing Info



Passing score:

- 750 or greater

ESSAYS/ DBQ

- You must answer the essay /DBQ questions to pass with a 750.
- Follow the essay prompt directions and cite your evidence.

Test Taking Tips Leading Up to Test Day



Utilize the online website to help become familiar with the test and testing platform.



Ask questions-You can always reach out to your math or language arts teacher with any questions.

Complete ALEKS daily , Achieve 3000 montly, and weekly test prep to the best of your ability. Pay attention in class.



Do not study right before the test.



Replace your negative thoughts about standardized testing , with positive affirmation.

Get a good night's sleep the day before testing.



Eat a good breakfast and stay hydrated.



Don't get nervous!



Avoid talking about the test in a negative way with students around you.

Ignore the other students in the class taking the test. Focus on yourself. Research shows students that finish early don't score well on standardized tests.


Test Taking Strategies



Read the directions to every single problem. Make sure you are answering the question.

→1→

Write out the work on scrap paper before completing the problem online.




Take your time, if you don't know a question feel free to skip it and go back to it at the end of the test. You can do this by bookmarking it.

→3→

Double check your work!



Don't leave anything blank. There is not a penalty for guessing answers.



Remember: circle = select one answer & Square = select 2 or more answers.
