PARIS TRIP 2024

Between Wednesday 13th and Friday 15th March, 27 MFL, Art and Photography students from years 9, 10 and 11 attended a residential trip to Paris. Students were able to practice French speaking and listening skills, take photos for Art and Photography projects, visit art galleries, see some amazing architecture and broaden their cultural experience.

On Wednesday morning, we started by visiting Montmartre and Sacré-Cœur, walking around the playground of the Impressionists. We then ascended the Eiffel Tower to get amazing views of the city below. After lunch we took a Seine river cruise to see the sites including the cathedral of Notre-Dame and the Left Bank.

Thursday started with a visit to the Paris Catacombs where we descended into the tunnels beneath Paris to see the eerie 'city of the dead'. After lunch, we visited the Palace of Versailles, the opulent home of Louis XIV and Marie Antoinette. We finished the day with a visit to Père Lachaise Cemetery to visit the graves of Jim Morrison and Oscar Wilde.

Friday started with a visit to Stade de France where we had a guided tour of the home of the French national football and rugby teams and host of the 2022 champions league final.

Preparations were well under way for the Olympics this summer.

Finally, we completed our tour with a visit to the Musée d'Orsay and saw the most complete collection of Impressionism and Post-Impressionism in the world. We arrived home at 10.30 on Friday night, exhausted but having had a fantastic cultural experience.

Y10: BEXHILL COLLEGE




On Wednesday the Y10s were taken to Bexhill College, where they enjoyed a taste of college life.


