Award Application Process:

Any Eatonville High School graduate who meets the following criteria is eligible to be nominated for the Award of Distinction.

1. The nominee must be an Eatonville graduate.

2. Ten years must have elapsed since the nominee's graduation.

3. Candidates demonstrate high academic, professional, artistic, humanitarian, or philanthropic excellence.

4. Documentation to verify the nominee's qualification must accompany the application. These might include, but are not limited to, awards, degrees, certificates, recommendations, news articles, etc. Written personal testimonials would also be considered.

Selection Timeline

Nominations are collected throughout the year and should be mailed to the Award Committee no later than May 31 to be considered for that year. Selections will be made in June. Inductees will be recognized at the Welcome Back Day for ESD teachers and staff in August. Applications received after May 31st will be considered the following year.
