Explorer Classroom



SMALL SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Explorer can accommodate up to 72 students each year, 1st through 5th grade, with the same class sizes as your neighborhood school. This small school size encourages a strong community between students, staff, and parents!



MULTI-AGE CLASSROOMS

While teachers follow district curriculum and Common Core Standards, multi-age classes allow for older students to develop leadership skills & model more sophisticated thinking.



STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY

Classrooms are set up to develop student independence, collaboration, and leadership skills.



Curriculum

- Common Core state standards are taught through the Lake Washington School District curriculum
- Math is taught by grade level
- Science & Social Studies are taught on an annual rotation



Enrichment Programs



FRIDAY CHOICE & EXPLORATIONS

2x per month / 4 Fridays in April

Hour-long school-wide parent-led enrichment activity.

(examples: programming, art projects, pig dissection, cryptography , magic tricks, etc.)



EXPLORER TIME

Weekly

Hour-long all-school activity time. Students in 1st-5th grade sing songs, perform skits, share presentations, & engage in multi-age group activities like STEM and team building.



ART SMART

2x per month

Parent-led art lessons designed to bring visual arts education into the classroom. Projects are saved and displayed throughout the year and displayed at an Artwalk and in an end-of-year portfolio.



FIELD TRIPS

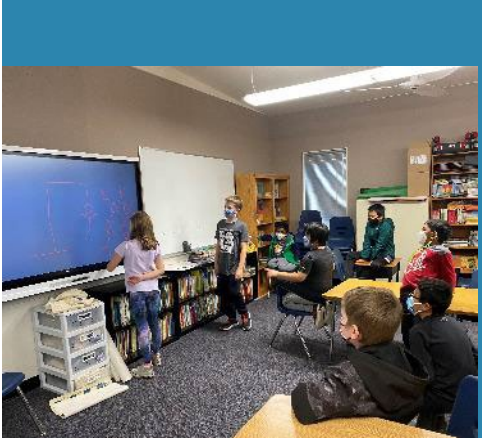
Monthly

Class field trips or educational learning experiences. Parents volunteer to drive and chaperone field trips.

(examples: aquarium, plays, museums, farms, etc.)



Enrichment Programs



PASSPORT

Monthly

Geography program where students study places around the world.



FAMILY CAMP & FALL RETREAT

Annually

A 1-day event in the fall and 2-day, overnight camp designed to build community among teachers, parents, and students and offer learning opportunities outside the classroom. Families participate in songs, games, and learning activities.



MARKETPLACE

Annually

Students learn about business & marketing while creating a product or service to sell to classmates and families using Explorer Bucks.



SOCIALS & COMMUNITY EVENTS

School community events are held throughout the year as a way for families and students to get to know each other.

(examples: First day tea, After drop off coffees, Fall social, Spring social, etc.)



A week in the life of an Explorer student

Kelly is in 3rd Grade and is in Ms. Shaw's Class

MONDAY

1:1 Writing Session

Kelly meets with Susan, a parent volunteer, to review her writing and help incorporate transitions into her personal narrative.



WEDNESDAY

Explorer Time

Kelly joins her multi-age group and works together to brainstorm design ideas for the scarecrow that will be added to the school garden.



TUESDAY

Math Support

Kelly and her same grade peers are taught a new math concept by Ms. Shaw, then have time to work independently and in groups to solidify the concept. A parent volunteer is there to help if she has any questions while the teacher is working with the other grade.

FRIDAY

Friday Choice

Kelly joins 7 other kids in a parent-led lesson on how to draw Harry Potter. She is thrilled to take her drawing home to show her parents!



THURSDAY

Passport

Teachers lead students in a lesson about the states that make up the Western US.



SATURDAY

Fall Social Event

Kelly, her parents, and her little brother, Will, meet up with other Explorer families for fun and games at the park for the school Fall social event.

Parents Play a Vital Role at Explorer

To be able to provide those enrichment experiences parents commit to (per child enrolled):

Parent Support	Description	Cadence
In-class volunteering	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Work as a personal tutor/mentor on a regular basis• Provide teacher support with classroom organization, filing and/or copying• Help teachers with special projects as needed	1 hour per week
Committee Work	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Participate in your assigned committee work (e.g. Safe departure)• You will be able to indicate your preferences from a provided list of options	1-2 hours per month
Attend Monthly Parent Meeting	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Parents and teachers meet monthly to discuss items related to school/classes	1x per month
Friday Choice & Explorations	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Plan and teach (1) Friday Choice activity to a small group of students• 4th grade families should also teach (1) Exploration	1x per year
Field Trip Driver & Chaperone	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Serve as field trip chaperones and drivers• Each family is to drive and chaperone a minimum of twice per year	2x per year
Support occasional school or campus-wide events	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Support events such as garden party, fun run or other periodic events that arise	Ad-hoc
Financial Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Requested donation of \$300-400 per child enrolled in the school (<i>scholarships available</i>)	1x per year





Parent Volunteering in the Classroom

Volunteering is a BIG part of what makes Explorer so successful. Students enjoy when parents come in and parents make a huge impact on the lives of the students and the teachers. Parent volunteering helps to free up teachers for more meaningful tasks.

- Work with small groups of kids (example: guiding an activity for reading, math groups, writing review)
- 1-on-1 (example: math review work)
- Clerical Work (copying, filing, etc.)

Responsibilities:

Math: Reteach math skills to individual students or small groups & help/monitor students working independently

Writing: Conference with students individually to improve their writing, get started, etc.

Correcting at home: Correct student work (answer keys provided!)

Clerical: Copying, cutting, correcting, hanging student work on walls, etc. Must be done at school on your assigned day.



Parent Committees

Parents at Explorer join committee groups to help plan and manage school events and activities. They are the backbone and support for our school. Committee work is done at home or at school.

Parent Perspective

INSIDE A MONTH AT EXPLORER

In-classroom Volunteering

Weekly you join your student's class to help with your preassigned duty such as writing or math support.



Parent Meeting

On the 3rd Tuesday of the month, you join other parents and hear updates from the teachers and committees.



After Drop Off Coffee Chat

On the last Friday of the month, you can choose to join other parents after drop off for coffee and chatting at Cypress Coffee.



Committee Coordination

Throughout the month you may collaborate with your assigned committee to complete support tasks for the school.



Friday Choice

One time per school year, you lead a small group of students in an enrichment activity of your choice.

Field Trip Driver & Chaperone

Two times during the year you sign up to drive and chaperone your child's class field trip.



Recommended Annual Donations

- Expected 2024-2025 school year donation of \$300-\$400 per child enrolled in the school
 - \$50 for school supplies (teacher purchases, not parents)
 - \$250-\$350 for activities and supplies (covers field trips, socials, student family camp costs & all enrichment activities your child participates in during the year)
- Scholarships are available
- Donations do not cover it all, we also depend on
 - Passive fundraisers (i.e., Employer matching)



Questions to Consider

- Is your student capable of working independently in a multi-aged classroom when needed?
- Are you able to provide transportation?
- Are you interested in actively participating in your child's education and offering support to other students as well?
- Can your family commit to dedicating 1-2 hours per week for in-class volunteering, committee work, and occasional requests (e.g., Friday choice, field trips)? *(no childcare provided for younger siblings)*
- Can your family commit to driving and chaperoning 2 field trips a year?
- Are you able to commit to your family's attendance at both our full-day fall retreat and overnight spring retreat?
- Are you enthusiastic about being part of an engaged parent community?
- What about Explorer most appeals to you?

- November 1, 2023 – online application opens at 9:00 a.m.
- December 1, 2023 – online applications due by 1:59 p.m.
- January 5, 2024 – lottery held at district
- January 12, 2024 – notification to families
- January 26, 2024 – acceptance deadline
