

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR KINDERGARTEN PARENTS



- <u>Kindergarten Assessment Process</u>: 8 total stations evaluating gross motor, fine motor, academics (2), language, vision, hearing, and speech. Altogether, it takes about an hour and parents are given info.
  - ✓ Cognitive results are the most important screening results.
  - ✓ The goal of kindergarten assessment is to place students in a position where they will be successful. All areas of the assessment are reviewed by a team of educational professionals.
  - ✓ A letter will be sent in the mail to you within 1-2 weeks with your child's results. The letter will provide our recommendation for placement based on where the child's holistic needs sit.
  - ✓ May be asked to retest in August before school starts if the child's readiness is questionable.

✓ The final decision is ultimately for the elementary principal to make.
<u>KinderKlub versus Kindergarten</u> : KinderKlub students attend half day classes and will advance to regular Kindergarten in 2025-2026 year upon completion. Benefit that KK gives is time for maturity. Transportation determines placement in morning or afternoon sessions.
If you are <u>missing important information for your child's file</u> , please see Lori Martin as soon as possible so that we can enroll your child without any difficulty. It is important that they start day 1!
Emergency Contacts: Please make sure that the office has the most current and correct information (address, home/cell/work phone numbers) just in case we need to contact you during the school day. If any of this information changes during the school year, please log on to <b>FinalForms</b> and update it. These are also used for our alerting system (delays, cancellations, events, reminders, etc.).
When communicating from home to school (this is very important), please include:  ✓ Your child's first name, last name, current grade, and teacher name are required.
<u>Tardy to school</u> : K-2 students are tardy when they show up later than 8:00am. We still want them to come and realize it isn't always their fault; however, they are counted as tardy. Please plan accordingly.
There is a \$35.00 book fee for each KK-6 <sup>th</sup> grade student. Please pay this today if possible, or pay at open house, or pay the first day of school by sending in a check to our office. On an envelope, please include your child's name, grade, and teacher name (when known). This fee can be paid as soon as possible.
If your child is absent, please call our office or the attendance line to report the reason for the absence. The attendance line number is 419.485.1700. This number will take calls 24 hours a day so leave a message if no one is there to answer. <i>Follow up notes with a valid reason are required for an excused absence</i> .
<u>Teachers are teaching during the school day so please do not call them in their classrooms</u> . We are doing our MOST IMPORTANT WORK with our students during this time. We thank you in advance for not interrupting. If you have an important message to give to your child, call our office at 419.485.6700 and we will make sure your child gets your message.
<u>AM Recess</u> : All K-2 students will be going outside <i>before</i> school starts from 7:50-8:05 to help their bodies and brains get ready to learn. Please make sure your child has appropriate clothes for the cold weather.

<u>School is important</u> : Good attendance is so important for learning. Begin early to teach and show your child that you value a quality education by having him/her at school daily and on time. In addition, we are learning all day long but we understand that occasionally your child may have an appointment. However, please do not pick up your child before school is out unless it is necessary. This will allow us to continue the learning process from the beginning of the day until the end. When possible, try to schedule appointments around school hours.
<u>Kindergarten Open House</u> : We bring kindergartners in with everyone else this year to give them an opportunity to find their classrooms, meet their teachers, and see the school—August 8 <sup>th</sup> , 2024 (5-6:30).
<u>Kindergarten Readiness Assessments</u> : These are one hour blocks that will run August 14 <sup>th</sup> -16 <sup>th</sup> . Teachers will set these up in the summer and they will take place prior to staggered start for kindergartners.
<u>Staggered Start</u> : Please pay attention to when your child begins school. Not all KK or kindergarten students will come on the first day. This allows teachers to begin with smaller groups of students to make the transition more comfortable for all. Each student will be assigned one day between August $19^{th} - 21^{st}$ .
First Day Jitters: It is normal for many kindergarten students to be shy, scared, or nervous about their first couple days at school. There will be some that cry, weep, and latch on when you stop to drop them off. We anticipate this and will help with the separation process. Please have conversations with your child about what to expect and know that they will be fine once they get out to recess and start playing!  ✓ Parents are NOT allowed to walk students through the halls without checking in the office first.  ✓ As announced (approximately after the first week of school), parents should drop their students off at the front door. Various staff members will be there to welcome them into the building.
<u>Schoology</u> : This is your one stop shop for everything related to your student/s academics. Also, we send out reminders throughout the year pointing you towards our Elementary Photo Album.
<u>Immunizations</u> : Your child's immunizations must be current as is stipulated by Ohio law. We will have a short grace period, but your child will be sent home until this is taken care of. These records can be sent into the school, dropped off in the office, or we can make copies for parents in the office. We will make sure the nurse receives the record.
<u>Fundraisers</u> : The school collects box tops, empty ink cartridges, and Tyson chicken proofs of purchase. Money raised from this goes back into the classrooms so students benefit greatly!
